4. **Rescission of Resolution (HR.48/10/2018) that Led to the Constitution of an Ad-hoc Committee to investigate the Circumstances Leading to the Invasion of Kofar Ruwa and Singha Markets by the Nigeria Customs Service in Kano, Pursuant to Order Nine, Rule (1) (6) of the Standing Orders of the House of Representatives:**  
**Hon. Edward G. Pwajok:**

**The House:**

*Notes* that on Tuesday 11 October, 2018, on a point of order, a Motion on the illegal seizure of rice and the brazen abuse of law by the Nigeria Customs service at kofar Ruwa and Singha markets in Kano, Kano State was considered;

*Also notes* that the Motion was referred to an Ad-hoc Committee which was constituted to investigate the illegal invasion:

*Aware* that recent developments revealed that the matter between the affected traders and the Nigeria Customs service has been amicably resolved in favour of the traders;

*Acknowledges* the need to reconsider the resolution agreed to and reverse itself;

**Resolves to:**

Rescind its Resolution (HR.48/10/2018) of Tuesday, 11 October, 2018.

5. **Rescission of Clauses 38 (m) and 45 (1) and (2) of the Discrimination against Persons with Disabilities (Prohibition) Bill, 2018 pursuant to Order Nine, Rule (1) (6) of the Standing Orders of the House of Representatives:**  
**Hon. Edward Gyang Pwajok:**

**The House:**

*Notes* that the Discrimination against Persons with Disabilities (Prohibition) Bill, 2018 was passed by both the House and the Senate with differences;

*Aware* that the two Houses had constituted Conference Committee which harmonized the differences in the Bill;

*Again aware* that the report of the Conference Committee was adopted in the two Houses and consequently forwarded to Clerk to the National Assembly for further legislative action;

*Also notes* that, in order to ensure that the Bill was passed in consonance with the provisions of Section 58 (3) of the 1999 Constitution (as amended), the Clerk to the National Assembly forwarded it to the Directorate of Legal Services of the National Assembly;

*Informed* that the Directorate of Legal Services of the National Assembly raised observations on Clauses 38 (m) and 45 (1) and (2) of the Bill as passed and therefore requires the clauses to be reworked before passing same;

***Resolves to:***

Commit Clauses 38 (m) and, 45 (1) and (2) of the Discrimination against Persons with Disabilities (Prohibition) Bill, 2018 to the Committee of the Whole for reconsideration and passage.

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**CONSIDERATION OF REPORTS****6. Committee on Public Petitions:****Hon. Uzoma Nkem-Abonta:*****Petition by D&K Golden City Investment Limited:***

“That the House do consider the Report of the Committee on Public Petitions on the Petition by D&K Golden City Investment Limited against the Director General/Chief Executive, Standards Organisation of Nigeria (SON) on refusal of the Management of SON to comply with the Orders of the Federal High Court of 27 February, 2011 and 8 December, 2014 in suit No. FHC. AWK/CS/37/2011 and No.1269/2014 and also for the Non Release of the factory Products and Machineries belonging to the Company seized by the Management of SON and approve the recommendations therein (Laid: 18/7/2018).

- (i) urge the Management of Standards Organization of Nigeria to return all the seized goods and factory equipment to D & k Golden City Investment Limited and also unseal the Company factory premises to enable it continue with the business activities of the Company;
- (ii) that the D & k Golden City Investment Limited goods were not substandard from all the certifications and documents presented. The issue was trademark of two Companies producing the same goods, brand and colour with the same design and mark, therefore the issue against D&K Golden City Investment Limited and SON was not of quality or substandardisation of goods but of trademark;
- (iii) that SON should return all Machineries belonging to D&K Golden City Investment Limited seized by the Organisation;
- (iv) that SON should return all seized products and raw materials seized from the D & k Golden City Investment Limited Factory and Warehouses;
- (v) that the Registrar of Trademark, Ministry of Trade and Investment is urged to delist the registration of Mr. Benjamin Ugochukwu Nwaizu trading under the name and style D&K Golden City Investment Nigeria Limited with the Trademark as the owner of Dorco;
- (vi) that D&K Golden City Investment Nigeria Limited should apply for Trademark and Design Registration of Trademark to fast track the registration upon application;
- (vii) that the said Ugochukwu Nwaizu trading under the name and style D&K Golden City Investment Nigeria Limited should be given a reasonable time to dispose of the products already manufactured while desisting from further production with the name Dorco;
- (viii) that the Vine Morris Links Limited should be allowed to carry on their business unhindered, being the first in time and properly registered with the Registrar, Trademark of the Ministry of Trade and Investment as Dorco TMN NO. 5444 in Class 8 and design Tl09N.

Urge the Federal Judicial Service Commission to reinstate Onyeme Ejime Paul, promote him to the next grade, if he had missed any promotion within the period, and pay all his salary arrears from February 2013 to date.

(i) uphold the recommendation of the Hon. Minister of State for Health by directing the Medical Director, Federal Medical Centre, Keffi to restore the salary of the Umeh Gabriel U. and pay all his arrears, entitlements and benefits;

(ii) that the Permanent Secretary should transfer Umeh Gabriel U. to another Federal Medical Centre so as to avoid further victimization on him, by the Management of the Federal Medical Centre, Keffi.

Afamefuna against the Nigeria Customs Service on the fraudulent disposal of his Consignment, Toyota 4 Runner with Chassis No. 204545 and a Bill of Lading No. 5306748982 and approve the recommendation therein” (*Laid: 17/7/2018*).

Urge the Comptroller General of the Nigeria Customs Service to do the needful by refunding all the money and expenses incurred by Mr. Nwora O. Afamefuna in the purchase of shipment and payment of his Toyota 4 Runner Jeep or in the alternative provide the prototype version of the same vehicle to Mr. Afamefuna within a shortest possible time.
