1. **Consolidation of Bills:**
 - (a) A Bill for an Act to Amend the Child's Rights Act, Cap. C50, Laws of the Federation of Nigeria, 2004 to Provide for Eligibility of Foreigners, whether Resident or Non-Resident in Nigeria as well as Nigerian Citizens not Resident in Nigeria to Adopt a Child, and to include the Prohibition of Sale of Alcohol by or to a Minor, Prohibit the Purchase of Alcohol for a Minor, Grant Police the Right to Confiscate Alcohol found in Possession of a Minor; and for Related Matters (HBS. 456 and 604) (*Hon. Joan Onyemaechi Mrakpor and Hon. Omoregie Ogbeide-Ihama*);

MOTIONS

8. Need to Commence the Construction of Ndoni-Aboh River Niger Bridge to Link Rivers and Delta States:

Hon. Uchechuku Nnam-Obi:

The House:

Notes that in 2013 the Federal Government awarded a contract to Bulletin Limited for the construction of Ndoni-Aboh River-Niger Bridge;

Concerned that since the award of the contract for construction of the said bridge in 2013, no construction work has commenced at the proposed sites of the bridge;

Aware that when the bridge is constructed, it will link Rivers State to Delta State and ease movements from Abia, Akwa-Ibom, Cross-River, Rivers and Bayelsa States to Benin in Edo State and other parts of the country;

Convinced of the importance of the bridge to the States in the South-South Zone of Nigeria and need for the Federal Government to release funds for its construction;

Resolves to:

Mandate the Committee on Niger Delta Development Commission (NDDC) to determine the cause of abandonment of the contract and ensure that it is re-awarded to a Firm that will speedily execute the project.

**9. Need to Investigate the Contract for the Upgrade of OML 58 Upgrade 1, the Execution of Obite-Ubeta-Rumuji (OUR) Pipeline and the Northern Option Pipeline Projects:
Hon. Sunday Marshall Katung:**

The House:

Notes that Nigeria has abundant natural resources including crude oil, natural gas and other minerals and in its effort to maximize value, the government of the federation through the Nigerian National Petroleum Corporation (NNPC) enters into various service agreements with International Oil Companies (IOCs);

Also notes that OML 58 Upgrade 1 is an integrated gas project designed to upgrade existing gas production facilities, while the Northern Option Pipeline (NOPL) is a 24"60km long pipeline running from Rumuji through Obigbo and terminating at Imo which is expected to supply gas to NLNG for export as well as to the Nigerian Gas Company for domestic consumption;

Further notes that the Obite-Ubeta-Rumuji (OUR) pipeline is a 42" by 45km pipeline which runs from Obite Gas Plant of the Bonny NLNG Plant to the Nigerian Agip Oil Company (NAOC)36" GTSA at Rumuji designed to lift gas for export through the NLNG and provide domestic gas through the Nigerian Gas Company;

Informed that on 25th July, 1991 the Nigerian National Petroleum Corporation (NNPC) entered into a Joint Operating Agreement with Total Exploration and Production Nigeria Limited (TEPNG) and, pursuant to the said Joint Operating Agreement, there was a Modified carry Agreement and award to TEPNG to execute the OML 58 upgrade 1 in 2008, Obite-Ubeta-Rumuji (OUR) Pipeline in 2010 and the Northern Option Pipeline in 2011;

Also informed that the contract for the upgrade of OML 58 upgrade 1 and the execution of the Northern Option Pipeline were awarded to SAIPIM/PONTICELLI/DESICON (SPD) and SAIPIM/DESICON (SD) Consortiums as the major contractors at an initial contract cost ceiling of \$1. 665 billion and \$472m and a completion date of 2012 and 2013 were set respectively;

Aware that during execution, the projects encountered some challenges which led to delays and subsequent increased cost incurred upon full completion resulting in the expenditure of about \$175m and \$170m which would have been avoidable;

Also aware that the contract for execution of the Obite-Ubeta-Rumuji (OUR) pipeline project in 2010 which was awarded to ZAKHEM/BAYWOOD Consortium as the major contractor at a cost of \$269, 293, 469 was delayed and incurred additional cost of over \$783m as at

December, 2015 and an additional \$48m upon full completion, which is an extra estimated \$135.3m which would have been as well avoidable;

Cognizant that the contract for the upgrade of OML 58 Upgrade 1 and the execution of the Northern Option Pipeline, occasioned a variance of \$903m and \$449m representing 31% and 95% respectively between the initial budgeted project sums and the cost incurred as at 31st December, 2015;

Concerned that of all the change orders presented to the NNPC and/or NAPIMS, there may not have been any approval for these requests for all the mentioned projects even though monies have been paid;

Also cognizant that there may have been a Value for Money (VFM) Audit of the above projects and the Identity of the contractors, thus the findings and actions taken by the NNPC and/or NAPIMS based on the recommendations, if any, need to be ascertained;

Further cognizant that there is need to ensure that all joint venture operations are subjected to adequate assessment to forestall inefficiency and ineffectiveness in the use of public funds;

Resolves to:

Mandate the Committee on Gas Resources to investigate the contract for the upgrade of OML 58 upgrade 1, the execution of the Northern Option Pipeline and the Obite-Ubeta-Rumuji Pipeline projects ranging from project governance and cost to the project and report back within four (4) months for further legislative action.

CONSIDERATION OF REPORT

10. Committee on Appropriations:

Hon. Mustapha Bala Dawaki:

“That the House do consider the Report of the Committee on Appropriations on a Bill for an Act to authorise the issue from the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Federation, the total sum of ₦9,120,334,988,225 (Nine Trillion, One Hundred and Twenty Billion, Three Hundred and Thirty Four Million, Nine Hundred and Eighty Eight Thousand, Two Hundred and Twenty Five Naira) only, of which the sum of ₦530,421,368,624 (Five Hundred and Thirty Billion, Four Hundred and Twenty One Million, Three Hundred Sixty Eight Thousand, Six Hundred and Twenty Four Naira) only is for Statutory Transfers, the sum of ₦2,203,835,365,699 (Two Trillion, Two Hundred and Three Billion, Eight Hundred and Thirty Five Million, Three Hundred and Sixty Five Thousand, Six Hundred and Ninety Nine Naira) only is for Debt Service, the sum of ₦3,512,677,902,077 (Three Trillion, Five Hundred and Twelve Billion, Six Hundred and Seventy Seven Million, Nine Hundred and Two Thousand, Seventy Seven Naira) only is for Recurrent (Non-Debt) Expenditure, while the sum of ₦2,873,400,351,825 (Two Trillion, Eight Hundred and Seventy Three Billion, Four Hundred Million, Three Hundred and Fifty One Thousand, Eight Hundred and Twenty Five Naira) only is for contribution to the Development Fund for Capital Expenditure for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 2018 (HB. 1207) (*Laid: 15/5/2018*) *Committee of Supply*.

A Bill for an Act to authorise the issue from the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Federation, the total sum of ₦9,120,334,988,225 (Nine Trillion, One Hundred and Twenty Billion, Three Hundred and Thirty Four Million, Nine Hundred and Eighty

Eight Thousand, Two Hundred and Twenty Five Naira) only, of which the sum of ₦530,421,368,624 (Five Hundred and Thirty Billion, Four Hundred and Twenty One Million, Three Hundred Sixty Eight Thousand, Six Hundred and Twenty Four Naira) only is for Statutory Transfers, the sum of ₦2,203,835,365,699 (Two Trillion, Two Hundred

and Three Billion, Eight Hundred and Thirty Five Million, Three Hundred and Sixty Five Thousand, Six Hundred and Ninety Nine Naira) only is for Debt Service, the sum of ₦3,512,677,902,077 (Three Trillion, Five Hundred and Twelve Billion, Six Hundred and Seventy Seven Million, Nine Hundred and Two Thousand, Seventy Seven Naira) only is for Recurrent (Non-Debt) Expenditure, while the sum of ₦2,873,400,351,825 (Two Trillion, Eight Hundred and Seventy Three Billion, Four Hundred Million, Three Hundred and Fifty One Thousand, Eight Hundred and Twenty Five Naira) only is for contribution to the Development Fund for Capital Expenditure for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 2018.

BE IT ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows: -

1. Issue and appropriation of ₦9,120,334,988,225 from the Consolidated Revenue Fund for 2018

- (i) The Accountant-General of the Federation shall, when authorised to do so by Warrants signed by the Minister charged with responsibility for finance, pay out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Federation during the year ending on the 31st day of December 2018, the sums specified by the warrants, not exceeding in the aggregate ₦9,120,334,988,225 (Nine Trillion, One Hundred and Twenty Billion, Three Hundred and Thirty Four Million, Nine Hundred and Eighty Eight Thousand, Two Hundred and Twenty Five Naira) only.
- (ii) The amount mentioned in subsection (1) of this section shall be appropriated to heads of expenditure as indicated in the Schedule to this Bill.
- (iii) No part of the amount aforesaid shall be released from the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Federation after the end of the year mentioned in subsection (1) of this section.

2. Release of funds from the Consolidated Revenue Fund

All amounts appropriated under this Bill shall be released from the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Federation only for the purpose specified in the Schedule to this Bill.

3. Virement

In the event that the implementation of any of the projects intended to be undertaken under this Bill cannot be completed without virement, such virement shall only be effected with the prior approval of the National Assembly.

4. Excess Revenue

- (i) The Accountant-General of the Federation shall immediately upon the coming into force of this Bill maintain a separate record for the documentation of Revenue accruing to the Consolidated Revenue Fund in excess of oil price benchmark adopted in this Budget
- (ii) Such revenues as specified in Sub-section (1) of this section refers to Revenues accruing from sales of government crude oil in excess of the approved benchmark price per barrel, the Petroleum Profit Tax and Royalty on Oil and Gas.

5. Authorization

- (i) No funds shall be paid out of the monies arising from the record specified in Section (4) except by an Act/approval of the National Assembly.
- (ii) The Accountant-General of the Federation shall forward to the National Assembly full details of funds released to the Government Agencies immediately such funds are released.

6. Release of funds for Implementation

The Minister of Finance shall ensure that funds appropriated under this Act are released to the appropriate agencies and or organs of government as and when due, provided that no funds for any quarter of the fiscal year shall be deferred without prior waiver from the National Assembly.

7. Due Process Certification

The Department of Government charged with the responsibility of certifying that due processes have been complied with in the processing of implementation of projects shall ensure that all processes of approval are completed within the specified period as provided for in the Public Procurement Act.

8. Information on Internally Generated Revenue

All Accounting Officers of Ministries, Parastatals and Departments of Government who control heads of expenditures shall upon the coming into effect of this Bill furnish the National Assembly on quarterly basis with detailed information on the Internally Generated Revenue of the agency in any form whatsoever;

9. Information on Extra Budgetary /Foreign Assistance

All Accounting Officers of Ministries, Parastatals and Departments of government who control heads of expenditures shall upon the coming into effect of this Bill furnish the National Assembly on quarterly basis with detailed information on all foreign and or domestic assistance received from any agency, person or organization in any form whatsoever.

10. Interpretation

For the purposes of this Bill the term "schedule" includes the detailed estimates of expenditure attached thereto

11. Commencement

In line with the provisions of Section 318 of the Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria 1999 as amended, this bill will run for a course of 12 months starting from the date it is assented into law.

12. Short Title

This Bill may be cited as the Appropriation Act 2018.

This Bill authorises the issue from the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Federation, the total sum of ₦9,120,334,988,225 (Nine Trillion, One Hundred and Twenty Billion, Three Hundred and Thirty Four Million, Nine Hundred and Eighty Eight Thousand, Two Hundred and Twenty Five Naira) only, of which the sum of ₦530,421,368,624 (Five Hundred and Thirty Billion, Four Hundred and Twenty One Million, Three Hundred Sixty Eight Thousand, Six Hundred and Twenty Four Naira) only is for Statutory Transfers, the sum of ₦2,203,835,365,699 (Two Trillion, Two Hundred and Three Billion, Eight Hundred and Thirty Five Million, Three Hundred and Sixty Five Thousand, Six Hundred and Ninety Nine Naira) only is for Debt Service, the sum of ₦3,512,677,902,077 (Three Trillion, Five Hundred and Twelve Billion, Six Hundred and Seventy Seven Million, Nine Hundred and Two Thousand, Seventy Seven Naira) only is for Recurrent (Non-Debt) Expenditure, while the sum of ₦2,873,400,351,825 (Two Trillion, Eight Hundred and Seventy Three Billion, Four Hundred Million, Three Hundred and Fifty One Thousand, Eight Hundred and Twenty Five Naira) only is for contribution to the Development Fund for Capital Expenditure for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 2018.
