FIRST VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS

Thursday, 11 May, 2017

1. The House met at 11.35 a.m. Mr Speaker read the Prayers.
2. **Votes and Proceedings**
Mr Speaker announced that he had examined and approved the *Votes and Proceedings* of Wednesday, 10 May, 2017.

The Votes and Proceedings was adopted by unanimous consent.

3. **Announcement**

- (b) **Legislative Measures Pending before Standing Committees:**

He stressed that the House might enforce the provisions of Order Seventeen, Rule 3 (g) in the event of non-compliance.

Motion made and Question proposed, "That a Bill for an Act to Amend the Council of Ministers (Evidence) Act, Cap. C12, Laws of the Federation of Nigeria, 2004 to make the Provisions of the Act Apply to the Federal Executive Council and for Other Related Matters (HB. 647) be now read a Second Time" (*Hon. Gideon Gwani — Kaura Federal Constituency*).

Bill withdrawn by leave of the House.

7. **A Bill for an Act to Make Provisions for the Prohibition of Stigmatization of Persons who are Victims of Insurgency or Militancy from Reintegration with the Community and to Provide for the Prosecution and Punishment of any Person or Group of Persons who Stigmatize such Victims with a view to Upholding and Projecting their Fundamental Rights to Dignity and Free Association as Provided by the Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, 1999 and for Other Related Matters (HB. 692) — Second Reading**

Order read; deferred by leave of the House.

8. **Rescission of Eight (8) Clauses of the Bill for an Act to Provide for the Establishment of the Federal University of Petroleum Resources, Effurun; and for Other Related Matters**

Motion made and Question proposed:

The House:

Notes that the Bill for an Act to Provide for the Establishment of the Federal University of Petroleum Resources, Effurun; and for Other Related Matters was passed by the National Assembly and transmitted to the President, Federal Republic of Nigeria, on 11 January, 2017 for assent;

Aware that on 7 February, 2017, the National Assembly withdrew the Bill after some issues were observed;

Desirous of rescinding the decisions of the House in the Long Title, Clauses 1 (5), 2 (1), 5 (e), 6 (7), 9 (2) and 29 of the Bill;

Resolves to:

- (i) rescind its decisions in the Long Title, Clauses 1 (5), 2 (1), 5 (e), 6 (7), 9 (2) and 29 of the Bill for an Act to Provide for The Establishment of the Federal University of Petroleum Resources, Effurun;
- (ii) amend the Bill by replacing the rescinded Clauses with the proposed amendments; and
- (iii) re-commit the proposed amendments to the Committee of the Whole for further legislative action (*Hon. Orker-Jev Emmanuel Yisa — Buruku Federal Constituency*).

Agreed to.

9. Rescission of Eight (8) Clauses of the Bill for an Act to Establish the National Institute for Cancer Research and Treatment of Patients in Nigeria; and for Other Related Matters
Motion made and Question proposed;

The House:

Notes that the Bill for an Act to Establish the National Institute for Cancer Research and Treatment of Patients in Nigeria; and for Other Related Matters was passed by the National Assembly and transmitted to the President, Federal Republic of Nigeria on 11 January, 2017 for assent;

Aware that on 7 February, 2017, the National Assembly withdrew the Bill after some issues were observed;

Desirous of rescinding the decision of the House in the Long Title, Clauses 3 (b), (c), (d) (v), 6, and 16 of the Bill;

Resolves to:

- (i) rescind its decisions in the Long Title, Clauses 3 (b), (c), (d), (v), 6 and 16 of the National Institute for Cancer Research and Treatment of Patients in Nigeria Bill;
- (ii) amend the Bill by replacing the rescinded Clauses with the attached document containing the proposed amendments sought; and
- (iii) refer the proposed amendments sought in the attached document to the Committee of the Whole for further legislative action (*Hon. Orker-Jev Emmanuel Yisa — Buruku Federal Constituency*).

Agreed to.

10. Rescission of Clauses 5 (f), 21 (3), 25 (2) (i) and (ii), 25 (3) (i) and 35 of the Bill for an Act to Amend the Public Procurement Act, 2007 (HB. 475), Pursuant to Order Nine, Rule 1 (6) of the Standing Orders of the House of Representatives

Motion made and Question proposed:

The House:

Notes that the Bill for an Act to Amend the Public Procurement Act of 2007 (HB.474) was considered in the Committee of the Whole on 15 March, 2017 following which the House approved the amendments of Clauses 5 (f), 21 (3), 25 (2) (i) and (ii), 25 (3) (i) and 35 of the Act;

Also notes that the Bill was read the Third Time and passed by the House on 16 March, 2017;

Aware that some issues concerning the amendments were observed after the passage of the Bill;

Desirous of rescinding the decision of the House in order to reflect the actual amendments intended to ease business operations in the country and ensure more efficient and effective implementation of approved annual budgets;

Resolves to:

- (i) rescind its decision in amending Clauses 5 (f), 21(3), 25 (2) (i) and (ii), 25 (3) (i) and 35 of the Public Procurement Act of 2007;
- (ii) amend the Bill by replacing the rescinded sections with the attached document containing the proposed amendments sought; and
- (iii) re-commit the proposed amendments sought in the attached document to the Committee of the Whole for further legislative action (*Hon. Orker-Jev Emmanuel Yisa — Buruku Federal Constituency*).

Agreed to.

Motion made and Question proposed, "That the House do suspend Order Eight, Rule 6 (2), to enable it take Item 14 on the Order Paper" (*Hon. Orker-Jev Emmanuel Yisa — Buruku Federal Constituency*).

Motion made and Question proposed, "That the House do consider the Report of the Committee on Appropriations on a Bill to authorise the issue from the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Federation the total sum of ₦7,441,175,486,758 (Seven Trillion, Four Hundred and Forty-One Billion, One Hundred and Seventy-Five Million, Four Hundred and Eighty-Six Thousand, Seven Hundred and Fifty-Eight Naira) only, of which, ₦434,412,950,249 (Four Hundred and Thirty-Four Billion, Four Hundred and Twelve Million, Nine Hundred and Fifty Thousand, Two Hundred and Forty-Nine Naira) only, is for Statutory Transfers, ₦1,841,345,727,206 (One Trillion, Eight Hundred and Forty-One Billion, Three Hundred and Forty-Five Million, Seven Hundred and Twenty-Seven Thousand, Two Hundred and Six Naira) only, is for Debt Service, ₦177,460,296,707 (One Hundred and Seventy-Seven Billion, Four Hundred and Sixty Million, Two Hundred and Ninety-Six Thousand, Seven Hundred and Seven Naira) only, is for Sinking Fund for maturing bonds, ₦2,987,550,033,436 (Two Trillion, Nine Hundred and Eighty-Seven Billion, Five Hundred and Fifty Million, Thirty-Three Thousand, Four Hundred and Thirty-Six Naira) only, is for Recurrent (Non-Debt) Expenditure while the sum of ₦2,177,866,775,867 (Two Trillion, One Hundred and

Seventy-Seven Billion, Eight-Hundred and Sixty-Six Million, Seven Hundred and Seventy-Five Thousand, Eight Hundred and Sixty-Seven Naira) only, is for contribution to the Development Fund for Capital Expenditure (Exclusive of Capital Expenditure in Statutory Transfers) for the year ending on 31 December, 2017 (*Hon. Mustapha Bala Dawaki — Dawakin Kudu/Warawa Federal Constituency*).

Question agreed to.

A BILL TO AUTHORISE THE ISSUE FROM THE CONSOLIDATED REVENUE FUND OF THE FEDERATION THE TOTAL SUM OF ₦7,441,175,486,758 (SEVEN TRILLION, FOUR HUNDRED AND FORTY-ONE BILLION, ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FIVE MILLION, FOUR HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SIX THOUSAND, SEVEN HUNDRED AND FIFTY-EIGHT NAIRA) ONLY, OF WHICH, ₦434,412,950,249 (FOUR HUNDRED AND THIRTY-FOUR BILLION, FOUR HUNDRED AND TWELVE MILLION, NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND, TWO HUNDRED AND FORTY-NINE NAIRA) ONLY, IS FOR STATUTORY TRANSFERS, ₦1,841,345,727,206 (ONE TRILLION, EIGHT HUNDRED AND FORTY-ONE BILLION, THREE HUNDRED AND FORTY-FIVE MILLION, SEVEN HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN THOUSAND, TWO HUNDRED AND SIX NAIRA) ONLY, IS FOR DEBT SERVICE, ₦177,460,296,707 (ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SEVEN BILLION, FOUR HUNDRED AND SIXTY MILLION, TWO HUNDRED AND NINETY-SIX THOUSAND, SEVEN HUNDRED AND SEVEN NAIRA) ONLY, IS FOR SINKING FUND FOR MATURING BONDS, ₦2,987,550,033,436 (TWO TRILLION, NINE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN BILLION, FIVE HUNDRED AND FIFTY MILLION, THIRTY-THREE THOUSAND, FOUR HUNDRED AND THIRTY-SIX NAIRA) ONLY, IS FOR RECURRENT (NON-DEBT) EXPENDITURE WHILE THE SUM OF ₦2,177,866,775,867 (TWO TRILLION, ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SEVEN BILLION, EIGHT-HUNDRED AND SIXTY-SIX MILLION, SEVEN HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND, EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-SEVEN NAIRA) ONLY, IS FOR CONTRIBUTION TO THE DEVELOPMENT FUND FOR CAPITAL EXPENDITURE (EXCLUSIVE OF CAPITAL EXPENDITURE IN STATUTORY TRANSFERS) FOR THE YEAR ENDING ON 31 DECEMBER, 2017

Clause 1: Issue and appropriation of ₦7,441,175,486,758 from the Consolidated Revenue Fund for 2017

- (1) The Accountant-General of the Federation shall, when authorised to do so by Warrants signed by the Minister charged with responsibility for finance, pay out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Federation during the year ending on the 31st day of December, 2017, the sums specified by the warrants, not exceeding in the aggregate ₦7,441,175,486,758 (Seven Trillion, Four Hundred and Forty-One Billion, One Hundred and Seven-Five Million, Four Hundred and Eighty-Six Thousand, Seven Hundred and Fifty-Eight Naira) only.
- (2) The amount mentioned in subsection (1) of this section shall be appropriated to heads of expenditure as indicated in the Schedule to this Bill.
- (3) No part of the amount aforesaid shall be released from the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Federation after the end of the year mentioned in subsection (1) of this section.

Committee Recommendation:

That the provision in Clause 1 be retained (*Hon. Mustapha Bala Dawaki — Dawakin Kudu/Warawa Federal Constituency*).

Question that Clause 1 do stand part of the Bill — Agreed to.

Clause 2: Release of funds from the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

All amounts appropriated under this Bill shall be released from the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Federation only for the purpose specified in the Schedule to this Bill.

Committee Recommendation:

That the provision in Clause 2 be retained (*Hon. Mustapha Bala Dawaki — Dawakin Kudu/Warawa Federal Constituency*).

Question that Clause 2 do stand part of the Bill — Agreed to.

Clause 3: Virement.

In the event that the implementation of any of the projects intended to be undertaken under this Bill cannot be completed without virement, such virement shall only be effected with the prior approval of the National Assembly.

Committee Recommendation:

That the provision in Clause 3 be retained (*Hon. Mustapha Bala Dawaki — Dawakin Kudu/Warawa Federal Constituency*).

Question that Clause 3 do stand part of the Bill — Agreed to.

Clause 4: Excess Revenue.

- (1) The Accountant-General of the Federation shall immediately upon the coming into force of this Bill maintain a separate record for the documentation of Revenue accruing to the Consolidated Revenue Fund in excess of oil price benchmark adopted in this Budget;
- (2) Such revenues as specified in subsection (1) of this section refers to Revenues accruing from sales of government crude oil in excess of \$44.5 per barrel, the Petroleum Profit Tax and Royalty on Oil and Gas

Committee Recommendation:

That the provision in Clause 4 be retained (*Hon. Mustapha Bala Dawaki — Dawakin Kudu/Warawa Federal Constituency*).

Question that Clause 4 do stand part of the Bill — Agreed to.

Clause 5: Authorization.

- (1) No funds shall be paid out of the monies arising from the record specified in Section (4) except by an Act of the National Assembly.
- (2) The Accountant-General of the Federation shall forward to the National Assembly full details of funds released to the Government Agencies immediately such funds are released.

Committee Recommendation:

That the provision in Clause 5 be retained (*Hon. Mustapha Bala Dawaki — Dawakin Kudu/Warawa Federal Constituency*).

Question that Clause 5 do stand part of the Bill — Agreed to.

Clause 6: Release of funds for Implementation.

The Minister of Finance shall ensure that funds appropriated under this Bill are released to the appropriate agencies and or organs of government as and when due, provided that no funds for any quarter of the fiscal year shall be deferred without prior waiver from the National Assembly.

Committee Recommendation:

That the provision in Clause 6 be retained (*Hon. Mustapha Bala Dawaki — Dawakin Kudu/Warawa Federal Constituency*).

Question that Clause 6 do stand part of the Bill — Agreed to.

Clause 7: Due Process Certification.

The department of government charged with the responsibility of certifying that due processes have been complied with in the processing of implementation of projects shall ensure that all processes of approval are completed within the specified period as provided for in the Public Procurement Act.

Committee Recommendation:

That the provision in Clause 7 be retained (*Hon. Mustapha Bala Dawaki — Dawakin Kudu/Warawa Federal Constituency*).

Question that Clause 7 do stand part of the Bill — Agreed to.

Clause 8: Information on internally generated revenue.

All Accounting Officers of Ministries, Parastatals and Departments of Government who control heads of expenditures shall upon the coming into effect of this Bill furnish the National Assembly on quarterly basis with detailed information on the Internally Generated Revenue of the agency in any form whatsoever.

Committee Recommendation:

That the provision in Clause 8 be retained (*Hon. Mustapha Bala Dawaki — Dawakin Kudu/Warawa Federal Constituency*).

Question that Clause 8 do stand part of the Bill — Agreed to.

Clause 9: Information on extra budgetary/foreign assistance.

All Accounting Officers of Ministries, Parastatals and Departments of Government who control heads of expenditures shall upon the coming into effect of this Bill furnish the National Assembly on quarterly basis with detailed information on all foreign and or domestic assistance received from any agency, person or organization in any form whatsoever.

Committee Recommendation:

That the provision in Clause 9 be retained (*Hon. Mustapha Bala Dawaki — Dawakin Kudu/Warawa Federal Constituency*).

Question that Clause 9 do stand part of the Bill — Agreed to.

Clause 10: Interpretation.

For the purposes of this Bill the term "schedule" includes the detailed estimates of expenditure attached thereto.

Committee Recommendation:

That the provision in Clause 10 be retained (*Hon. Mustapha Bala Dawaki — Dawakin Kudu/Warawa Federal Constituency*).

Question that Clause 10 do stand part of the Bill — Agreed to.

Clause 11: Commencement.

In line with the provisions of Section 318 of the Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, 1999 (as amended), this Bill will run for a course of 12 months starting from the date it is assented into law.

Committee Recommendation:

That the provision in Clause 11 be retained (*Hon. Mustapha Bala Dawaki — Dawakin Kudu/Warawa Federal Constituency*).

Question that Clause 11 do stand part of the Bill — Agreed to.

Clause 12: Short Title.

This Bill may be cited as the Appropriation Bill, 2017.

Committee Recommendation:

That the provision in Clause 12 be retained (*Hon. Mustapha Bala Dawaki — Dawakin Kudu/Warawa Federal Constituency*).
