Hon. Edward Gyang-Pwajok:

The House:

Notes that a Bill for an Act to Amend the National Orientation Agency Act, Cap. N100 LFN 2004 to Provide for an Operational Framework for the Global Initiative for Harmony Corps in Order to Promote Inter-Ethnic Integration, Mediation, Peace-Building, Mutual Understanding, Patriotism for Peaceful Co-Existence; and for Related Matters was passed by the Senate and transmitted to the House for Concurrence;

Also notes that on Wednesday 8 May, 2019 debate on the general principles on the Bill was concluded but negatived;

Aware of additional information on the importance of the Bill for the Promotion of Inter-Ethnic Integration, Mediation, Peace-Building, Mutual Understanding, Patriotism for Peaceful Co-Existence in Nigeria;

Desirous of the need to reconsider the position of the House on the Bill.

Resolves to:

Rescind its decision of Wednesday 8 May, 2019 on the Bill and rescheduled it for further legislative action.

- 11. Re-Committal of the Energy Commission of Nigeria Act (Amendment) Bill, 2018 and the Nigerian Correctional Service Bill, 2018:**
Hon. Edward Gyang Pwajok:

The House:

Notes that the Energy Commission of Nigeria Act (Amendment) Bill, 2018 and the Nigerian Correctional Service Bill, 2018 were separately passed by the National Assembly and transmitted to the President for assent but were returned with some observations which need to be addressed;

Aware that the observations are germane for the smooth operations of the Bills if eventually assented to;

Resolves to:

Rescind its decisions on Clauses 17(5) and 44(d) of the Energy Commission of Nigeria Act (Amendment) Bill, 2018 and Clause 8 of the Nigerian Correctional Service Bill, 2018 as passed and re-commit same to the Committee of the Whole for reconsideration and passage.

12. Need for the National Assembly to Approve the Proposal by the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) to Create Two State Constituencies from Guma State Constituency of Benue State:

Hon. Edward Gyang Pwajok:

The House:

Notes that Section 91 of the Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, 1999 (as amended) provides that subject to the provisions of this “Constitution, a House of Assembly of a State shall consist of three or four times the number of seats that State has in the House of Representatives divided in a way to reflect, as far as possible, nearly equal population”;

Also notes that the same section provides that a House of Assembly of a State shall consist of not less than twenty-four and not more than forty Members;

Further notes that Section 112 of the 1999 Constitution provides that “subject to the provisions of Sections 91 and 113 of the 1999 Constitution, the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) shall divide every State in the Federation into such number of State Constituencies as is equal to three or four times the number of Federal Constituencies within that State”;

Aware that Section 113 of the 1999 Constitution provides that “the boundaries of each State Constituency shall be such that the number of inhabitants thereof is as nearly equal to the population quota as is reasonably practicable”;

Also aware that Section 114 of the 1999 Constitution provides that “the Independent Electoral Commission shall review the division of every State into Constituencies at intervals of not less than ten years, and may alter such Constituencies in accordance with the provisions of this Section to such extent as it may consider desirable in the light of the review”;

Cognizant that Benue State has 11 Federal Constituencies and 29 State Constituencies;

Also cognizant that by the constitutionally prescribed threshold of minimum number of state constituencies per state, Benue State should have a minimum of 33 State Constituencies;

Further aware that the Supreme Court of Nigeria, in the case of INEC V GUMA LOCAL Government Council, Suit No. (SC/195/2016), ordered the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) to create additional Agasha State Constituency from GUMA State constituency of Benue State;

Acknowledges that INEC has taken steps to comply with the Supreme Court Judgment by consulting all stake holders and undertaking trothing exercise to map the boundaries of the area concerned;

Also acknowledges the receipt of a Proposal from INEC dated 18 April 2019 requesting the National Assembly to approve the establishment of Two State Constituencies from Guma State Constituency of Benue State;

Resolves to:

Approve the Proposal by Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) that the boundaries of Guma State Constituency be altered by creating two state Constituencies as designated below:

1. Guma State Constituency, comprising
 - (i) Mbabai 03
 - (ii) Mbadwem (04)
 - (iii) Mbawa (05)
 - (iv) Mbayer/Yandev (06)
 - (v) (Nyiev (07)
 - (vi) Uvir (10), and
2. Agasha State Constituency, comprising
 - (i) Abinsi (01)
 - (ii) Kaambe (02)

(iii) Nzorov (08)

(iv) (Saghev (09)
