28. ***Ad-hoc Committee to interface with the National Electricity Regulatory Commission (NERC) and other stakeholders to critically evaluate the MYTO System:***

**Hon. Aminu Ashiru Mani:**

“That House do receive the Report *Ad-hoc* Committee to Interface with the National Electricity Regulatory Commission (NERC) and Other Stakeholders to Critically Evaluate the MYTO System and Re-assess all its Inputs and Assumptions in order to come up with a realistic and acceptable Tariff Regime in Nigeria. (HR. 58/2017)(*Referred: 20/7/2017*).

- (i) That the Regulator (NERC) needs to be more assertive and more independent minded in guiding the affairs of the industry;
- (ii) that the regulator needs to come up with a road map that will be made public that will explain how she intends to guide the market through the turbulent times we are now in;
- (iii) that the Executive through the CBN needs to come up with a formula that will ensure that the forex components of the MYTO tariff and protect it from forex fluctuations;
- (iv) that the Ministry of Petroleum and the Ministry of Power, Works and Housing needs to stop working in silos and MUST work together to have common front so that gas which Nigeria produces should not be sold to Nigerians in USD;
- (v) that the Industry should come up with a platform or event or seminar where there will be a yearly constructive engagement between the executive, the legislature and the judiciary on key issues of NESI.

29. **Committee on Army:**  
**Hon. Rimamnde Shawulu Kwewum:**

“That the House do receive Report of the Committee on Army on Need to Investigate the Murder of dr. Ferry Gderegde and other Unarmed Civilians by Men of the Federal Special Anti-Robbery Squad (FSARS) and the Nigerian Army In Rivers State. (HR. 13/04/2019)(*Laid: 30/5/2019*).

- (i) That there is the urgent need to start withdrawing soldiers from the streets across the country and replace them with internal security operators;
- (ii) that the Federal Government should re-orientate the Police in order to make it exhibit and sustain the required civility.
- (iii) that Every Commanding officer in the Police (FSARS Branch), especially ACP Akin Fakorede, should be investigated and sanctioned if found culpable.
- (iv) that Adequate compensation be paid by the Federal Government to the families of the deceased and the victims after a proper assessment of the losses and deaths;
- (v) urged the Rivers State Government to empanel a coroner's inquest to determine the cause of the death of Dr. Gberegbe, given the controversy and tension generated over the circumstance and cause of the death.
