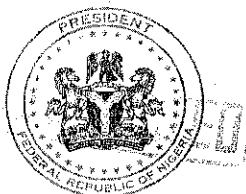

**PRESIDENTIAL DECISION TO DECLINE ASSENT TO
THE NATIONAL TRANSPORT COMMISSION BILL, 2018**

*Pursuant to Section 58 (4) of Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, 1999 (as amended), I hereby convey to the House of Representatives, my decision, on 18th April, 2019 to decline Presidential Assent to **National Transport Commission Bill, 2018** recently passed by the National Assembly.*

2. *I am declining assent to the Bill because:*

- (i) *The broad regulatory ambit of the proposed National Transport Commission (NTC) over the operation and management of the vast Nigeria Transport Sector subordinating all subsisting institutions and structures to the NTC conflicts with areas of regulatory oversight of the recently established Federal Competition and Consumer Protection Commission;*
- (ii) *The Bill seeks under Part XXI Section 110 (1) & (2) to take away the authority of the Minister for Works as conferred by the Federal Highways Act in the management, direction and control of Federal Highways in Nigeria and vest the power in the Commission;*
- (iii) *The provision of Sections 107 (3), 108 and the Third Schedule to the Bill which attempt to transfer the obligations and liabilities of the Nigerian Shippers' Council to the Commission and transmute the Nigeria Shippers' Council into the National Transport Commission are misconceived. The Commission should be established as a new entity in view of the required skill set and expertise for the performance of its regulatory function.*

Also notes that the members of the Boys' Brigade were in a procession celebrating Easter in Gombe metropolis, when a car rammed into them killing 11 and injuring many others;

Observed that the driver of the car had a heated argument with the children before they made way for him to pass, only for him, in a rage, to turn and drive into them;

Disturbed that the driver of the car who was later identified as an official of the Nigeria Security and Civil Defence Corps (NSCDC) shot at the children before ramming into them;

Concerned that eye witness report indicated that the NSCDC official was drunk and plunged into the procession on purpose;

Resolves to:

- (i) mandate the Committee on Interior to investigate the matter and report back within two weeks;
- (ii) observe one minute silence in honour of the deceased children; and
- (iii) extend condolence message to the Government and people of Gombe State (*Hon. Aishatu Jibril Dukku — Dukku/Nafada Federal Constituency*)

The department of government charged with the responsibility of certifying that due processes have been complied with in the processing of implementation of projects shall ensure that all processes of approval are completed within the specified period as provided for in the Public Procurement Act.

Committee Recommendation:

That the provision in Clause 8 be retained (*Hon. Mustapha Bala Dawaki — Dawakin Kudu/Warawa Federal Constituency*).

Question that Clause 8 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.

Clause 9: Information on Internally Generated Revenue.

All Accounting Officers of Ministries, Parastatals and Departments of Government who control heads of expenditures shall upon the coming into effect of this Bill furnish the National Assembly on quarterly basis with detailed information on the Internally Generated Revenue of the agency in any form whatsoever;

Committee Recommendation:

That the provision in Clause 9 be retained (*Hon. Mustapha Bala Dawaki — Dawakin Kudu/Warawa Federal Constituency*).

Question that Clause 9 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.

Clause 10: Information on Extra Budgetary/Foreign Assistance.

All Accounting Officers of Ministries, Parastatals and Departments of Government who control heads of expenditures shall upon the coming into effect of this Bill furnish the National Assembly on quarterly basis with detailed information on all foreign and or domestic assistance received from any agency, person or organization in any form whatsoever. For the purposes of this Bill the term "schedule" includes the detailed estimates of expenditure attached thereto

Committee Recommendation:

That the provision in Clause 10 be retained (*Hon. Mustapha Bala Dawaki — Dawakin Kudu/Warawa Federal Constituency*).

Question that Clause 10 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.

Clause 11: Interpretation.

For the purposes of this Bill the term "schedule" includes the detailed estimates of expenditure attached thereto

Committee Recommendation:

That the provision in Clause 11 be retained (*Hon. Mustapha Bala Dawaki — Dawakin Kudu/Warawa Federal Constituency*).

Question that Clause 11 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.

Clause 12: Commencement.

In line with the provisions of Clause 318 of the Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, 1999 (as amended), this Bill will run for a course of 12 months starting from the date it is assented into law.
