




PRESIDENTIAL DECISION TO DECLINE ASSENT TO  
NIGERIAN PEACE CORPS (ESTABLISHMENT) BILL, 2017  
RECENTLY PASSED BY THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY


Pursuant to Section 58(4) of the Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria 1999 (as amended), I hereby convey to the House of Representatives, my decision, on 25<sup>th</sup> January, 2018 to decline Presidential Assent to the Nigerian Peace Corps (Establishment) Bill, 2017 recently passed by the National Assembly.

2. Specifically, reasons for the decision to decline assent to this Bill include among others:

- Security concerns regarding the proposed Nigerian Peace Corps being authorized to undertake activities currently being performed by extant security and law enforcement agencies; and



- b. Financial implications of funding the establishment and operations of the proposed Nigerian Peace Corps, given the scarce financial resources may pose serious challenge to the Government.
