REPORT ON THE FEDERAL POLYTECHNICS AMENDMENT BILL

2018 (SB. 241)

1.0 INTRODUCTION:

The **FEDERAL POLYTECHNICS AMENDMENT BILL 2018 (SB. 241)** was sponsored by Sen. MALAM Ali WAKILI, MNI. On Wednesday, 12th October, 2016, the Senate deliberated on the general principles of the Bill. During the debate, Senators commended the sponsor of the Bill for coming up with the proposed legislation, as it sought to address the call to reposition the Nigerian polytechnic system to enhance the quality and relevance of polytechnic learning and foster employability of the graduates. After extensive debate on the general principles of the Bill, it was read the *Second Time* and referred to the Senate Committee on Tertiary Institutions and TetFund for further legislative action and to report back its recommendations.

The Federal Polytechnics Act, 1978 was originally conceptualized within the framework of a lean economy and a non-globalized world. The Act was amended in 1987, 1993 and in 2004. Despite these amendments, the Act is still replete with structural flaws and archaic provisions. This is particularly so because, over the years, the advancement in technology have made factories to become more automated, and industries have become more knowledge-driven. These have brought to the fore the short comings of the existing Act. Equally, the pressure of a robust and complex economy and a globalised learning environment demand a fundamental review of the Act to reflect contemporary realities.

The core areas intended to be strengthened by this present amendment are: Functions of Each Polytechnic, the structures of the Governing Boards, the Academic Boards, and the Management, as well as the Tenure of Principal Officers.

The Bill is also intended to formally schedule nine Federal Polytechnics which had hitherto not been included in the existing law in previous amendments.

2.0 COMMITTEE'S CONSIDERATION OF THE BILL:

The Committee held meetings and then Public Hearings where the various stakeholders in the education sector were in attendance. The Public Hearing was well attended and all the stakeholders were in agreement with the intendment of the Bill. The outcome assisted the Committee in scrutinizing the Bill.

3.0 COMMITTEE'S RECOMMENDATIONS:

In making a case for this review of the Federal Polytechnics Act, we have compared the extant Act with the laws establishing the institutions in the other tiers of tertiary education in Nigeria, to wit, universities and colleges of education, which are clearly more suited for tertiary institutions.









The Committee has therefore made recommendations as captured in the foregoing tabular report.

The suggested amendments reflect the content of the laws establishing universities and are intended to realign the laws of the Polytechnics to suit the operations of contemporary technical educational institutions. Among other things, the passage of this amendment Bill will relieve polytechnics of the encumbrances inherent in the subsisting Act and make the institutions more efficient and functional as institutions of higher learning.

The Committee therefore recommends that the Senate do approve the recommendations and expresses its profound gratitude to the entire Senate for support it always extend to this committee.
