REPORT OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON WATER RESOURCES ON A BILL FOR AN ACT TO AMEND THE RIVER BASIN DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY ACT, CAP R9, LFN 2004

1.0 Introduction:

The Senate of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, at its sitting on Thursday, 10th November, 2016, read the River Basin Development Authority Act CAP R9 LFN, 2004 (Amendment) Bill, 2016, the Second Time and referred same to the Committee on Water Resources for further legislative action.

2.0 Objectives of the Bill:

The Bill seeks to:

- a. create an additional River Basin Development Authority to cater for some States of the South East;
- b. divide the existing Anambra Imo River Basin Development Authority into two, (Imo River Basin Development Authority to cater for Imo and Abia States; and Anambra River Basin Development Authority to cater for Anambra, Enugu and Ebonyi States);
- c. change the nomenclature of the Chief Executive of River Basins
 Development Authorities from General Manager to Managing
 Director;
- d. align the jurisdiction of the various River Basins Development Authorities for ease of reference and administration;

e. Provide the legal basis for some of the existing River Basin Development Authorities that had no law creating them, e.g. Lower Niger River Basin Development Authority comprising of Kwara and Kogi States with headquarters in llorin

3.0 Highlights of the Committee Activities on the Bill:

Upon receipt of the notice of referral, the Committee met and resolved to organize a public hearing on the Bill. The Committee held a two-day public hearing on the Bill on Tuesday, 5th and Wednesday, 6th of December, 2017 with subsequent mark-up sessions.

4.0 Amendment of sessions:

The proposed amendment to the act covers the following sections:

- a. Section (1) (3) amendments;
- b. Section (4) Remuneration, new insertion;
- c. Section (6) amendment;
- d. First schedule, [Section 1(1)] amendment;
- e. Second Schedule, [Section 2(2).] amendment

5.0 Recommendations:

After deliberation on the various sections proposed for amendment in the River Basin Development Act, Cap R9, LFN 2004, the Committee made the following recommendations:

- a. Section 1-3 proposed for amendment was retained as proposed;
- b. The Committee retained the proposed insertion of New Section 4 "Remuneration" as the existing Act did not provide for such;
- c. Section 6, now Section 7 in the proposed amendment was retained as it only changes the nomenclature of the "General Manager" to "Managing Director".
- d. First Schedule, Section 1(1), Item No. 1, the existing Anambra Imo River Basin Development Authority, replacement was proposed as: "Anambra RBDA". Area of Operation "The whole of Anambra, Enugu and Ebonyi States, Headquarters Enugu".
- e. First Schedule, Section 1(1), proposed New item was inserted as:
 No. 6 "Imo River RBDA". Area of operation "The whole of Abia
 and Imo States, Headquarters Owerri". The Committee
 retained the proposal of additional River Basin Development
 Authority to cater for some States of the South East;

6.0 Conclusion:
