MOTION

1. Urgent need for the Repairs/Re-construction and Dualization of Okene - Auch - Ekpoma - Benin Road

Senator Francis Alimikhena (Edo North)

The Senate:

Notes that road infrastructure is critical for economic and commercial development and is one of the most visible signs of government presence in any community or state;

Observes that the Okene - Auch - Ekpoma - Benin Road is the only major highway that connects South/South, South East to Abuja and the Northern Parts of Nigeria;

Worried that large sections of the road, especially from Okene - Auch - Ekpoma to Benin have become dangerous craters that can no longer serve as road. It will be impossible to access, if not repaired before the raining season;

Aware that the Federal Road Maintenance Agency (FERMA) used to do palliative road maintenance on this road, however since 2016 FERMA has abandoned its responsibility. This has led to total collapse of the road thus making it difficult to access, especially Auch - Ewu - Ekpoma section of the road;

Concerned that travel time between Abuja to Benin used to be 6 hours but with the total collapse of the road, now averages 10 hours;

Disturbed that Armed Robbers and Kidnappers taking advantage of the totally deplorable state of the road have become a law unto themselves, ambushing, robbing, dispossessing and killing commuters at will on a daily basis;

Notes that the state of the road requires immediate rehabilitation to reduce the unacceptable level of accidents, robbery and kidnapping on the road;

Aware that the contract for the dualization and reconstruction of the road was awarded to some contractors over 6 years ago and that in the 2016 Appropriation Budget the sum of ₦5B was allocated to two sections of the road leaving the section from Auch to Ewu; •

Observes that this method of selective allocation of fund adopted by the Ministry of Power, Works and Housing in allocating funds on this road is worrisome to our people;

Worried that inspite of the ₦58bn allocation, the contractors abandoned the work on the road on the grounds that the funds allocated for the project was not cash backed,

Accordingly resolves to:

- i. Urge the Federal Ministry of Power, Works and Housing to urgently mobilize the contractors to site;
- ii. Urge FERMA and the Ministry of Power, Works and Housing to Urgently repair the failed portions of the road especially Auch - Ewu - Ekpoma sections;
- iii. Urge the Federal Government to ensure cash backing for the project in the 2017 budget; and
- iv. Mandate the Senate Committee on Works to carry out effective oversight on the project before the rainy season commences fully.

2. **Recent Boat Mishap and Loss of Life in the Kanji Dam of River Niger, Ngaski Local Government, Kebbi State, Federal Government of Nigeria**

Sponsor: Senator Bala Ibn Na'Allah (Kebbi South)

The Senate:

Notes the recent Boat mishap in Ngaski Local Government in Kebbi South Senatorial district of Kebbi State where 26 lives were lost while some persons are still missing and unaccounted for in the River Niger;

Concerned that the issue of boat mishaps have become a recurring yearly issue with loss of life;

Aware that these same communities were the very communities resettled by the then Northern regional Government in order to build the current kanji dam to provide Electricity for the Country;

Disturbed that despite this development, which has become an annual unfortunate occurrence, nothing has been done to prevent future re-occurrence,

According resolves to:

- i. Urge the Ministry of Transport through the National Inland Waterways Authority to immediately Conduct a survey into the Stretch of River Niger in the area with a view to putting safe Navigational aid in place;
- ii. Urge the Federal Government to assist the Communities in blasting the big stones and cutting the big trees in the River that hinders safe navigation around the Area;
- iii. Urge the National Emergency Management Agency to assist the Communities with relief materials in order to cushion the effect of the disaster; and
- iv. Urge the Government to assist the Communities with Modern 50 Seater Boats in order to alleviate the transportation needs of the Communities.
