EXECUTIVE COMMUNICATION

1. 2016 - 2018 External Borrowing (Rolling) Plan
Senate Leader

-That the Senate do consider the request of Mr. President C-n-C for the Separation of States Projects from items in the 2016 – 2018 External Borrowing (Rolling) Plan.

MOTIONS

1. Communal Clash between Wanikade and Wanihem Communities of North Ukelle, Yala Iga, Cross River North.

Sponsor: Senator Rose O. Oko (*Cross River North*)

The Senate:

Notes that the Wanikade and Wanihem communities of Ukelle North comprising of over 300 villages in Yala LGA of Cross River North have lived together as one;

Further notes that in the past few years, there has been disputes between them over land ownership at their boundaries;

Also notes that in the year 2012 the Courts had maintained that the two communities stay out of the land in contention until a proper resolution was reached;

Alarmed that on 26th June 2017, one of the communities entered the disputed land to farm in breach of the Court Order;

Further alarmed that a dispute resulting in breach of peace erupted between the communities;

Alarmed that what ensued resulted in a near annihilation of several villages namely, Lem Ukelle, Oyeche, Mankiliti, Ozegbe, Oyoba, Ehetezi, Elahen, Wanazeta, Ndenyuma, Onyogbe, where over a thousand houses and institutions like hospitals and schools were razed, while both communities suffered over a hundred deaths and several other persons were wounded;

Concerned that about 14,000 IDPs are currently in several locations including, Adum, Epwa, Ameka, Okuku, Igbegi, Ohuhu, Oori Obotu Uwokwu and Ikori, all in Oju Local Government Area of Benue State and within the peaceful parts of Ukelle in Yala LGA;

Notes that a dispatch of both the Military and Police is currently stationed in the concerned Communities to maintain peace;

Concerned that even if peace is restored, the IDPs cannot go back in the near future because they have lost their homes;

Further concerned that if the sanitary conditions in the IDP Centers as well as food, and other essential commodities are not provided soon, there will be outbreaks of diseases and starvation leading to a humanitarian crisis,

Accordingly resolves to:

- i. *Direct the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) to make urgent arrangements to provide food, medicines, blankets, mattresses and other essentials to the IDPs both in Benue State and other parts of Yala LGA in Cross River State;*
- ii. *Commend the Benue State Government, Oju LGA and Cross River State Government for sending relief materials to the Centers in Benue, though inadequate;*

- iii. Request the Nigerian Army to maintain Military presence until the security situation is contained and lasting peace restored;
 - iv. Urge the Cross River State Government to quickly resolve the conflict on a sustainable basis through appropriate boundary delineation; and
 - v. Refer the matter to the relevant Committees and report back within two (2) weeks.
2. The urgent need to avoid the imminent disruption of full academic activities and closure of the University of Maiduguri due to rising insecurity occasioned by the spate of suicide bomb attacks.

The Senate:

Notes the disturbing trend of rising insecurity at the University of Maiduguri, one of the foremost citadels of learning in the country;

Disturbed that due to the location of this great institution in Maiduguri which is the epicenter of the protracted Boko Haram insurgency, the school is gradually but persistently becoming a soft target and signature battle point in the fight against insurgency;

Notes that this foremost institution which can safely be described as the last institution standing following the advent of Boko Haram insurgency in the North-East is on the verge of caving in to the relentless assault on it by the insurgents;

Observes that in recent times, the Boko Haram insurgents have adopted the tactics of unbridled suicide bombings targeted at the institution with a view to bringing the University down to its knees; this is a situation that must never be allowed to happen in our generation;

Acknowledges that this unfortunate new wave of violence which is drawing public outcry and condemnations from home and abroad, has heightened fears that unless something urgent is done, the once most peaceful and globally competitive center for multi-cultural research and learning may be converted into another theatre of war;

Recalls that this institution used to be the jewel of and the main signpost of academic excellence in Nigeria boasting of and attracting some of the best and finest Professors from across the globe. Sadly, we have lost one of the best hands still available in the campus today, to the current insecurity on the campus- Late Professor Aliyu Usman Mani who was killed together with two students when the institution was attacked by two suicide bombers on Monday, the 16th of January 2017;

Sadly notes that over 70 Professors, several students and staff have left the University during the height of the ongoing insecurity in the campus to other universities within and outside the country due to fear;

Observes that Between January 16 and June 25 - a period spanning six months - the university community was hit with six suicide bomb blasts which resulted in the death of 19 students and staff of the school;

Observes further that the current porous state of the security in the institution, coupled with the vast expanse of land it sits on and the external conditions of security across the state has exacerbated the situation and made these attacks more effective;

Observes that the peculiarity of the University of Maiduguri and the difficult environment it is operating makes it imperative for the Federal Government to take urgent and extraordinary steps to protect and safeguard the institution from further violation of the peace and tranquility of the institution;

Notes that the need for government to then take extra measures to ensure effective fencing of the perimeters of the complex, deploy special unit security at the campus and mobilize modern security equipment for total surveillance and intrusion detectors to boost the security of the institution;

Further notes that currently only 3.65km of the university boundary has been fenced leaving a balance of about 23.7km,

Accordingly resolves to:

- i. *Urge* the federal government to urgently intervene and immediately put in place extraordinary measures to ensure the full restoration of the peace and tranquility of the University of Maiduguri, including the immediate perimeter fencing of the school and the deployment of critical security systems to ensure full surveillance and detection of security breaches;
 - ii. *Call* on the security agencies to submit to the Senate a comprehensive plan of action to contain, maintain and assure the constant security of the University of Maiduguri in particular and the host community of the school; and
 - iii. *Call* on the minister of Education through the TETFUND to take further measures to revamp the security infrastructure by immediately embarking on the fencing of the institution as well as take other measures to reassure the university community of their security and protection.
3. The need for urgent renovation of the facilities and infrastructure of the Akanu Ibiam International Airport Enugu.

The Senate:

Observes that the Akanu Ibiam International Airport in Enugu was upgraded to the status of International Airport on August 24, 2013;

Notes that the upgrade of the airport was a fulfilment of the dreams of the people of South-East of Nigeria who are famed entrepreneurs and have long clamoured for direct flights to parts of the world where they engage in myriad of commercial activities in order to cut costs associated with logistics and distance;

Notes that as an International Gateway for an important part of Nigeria, aside the technical requirements for the upgrade to international airport status by the extension, asphaltting, marking and standardization of the runways to accommodate bigger aircraft, there was also the requirement for improved facilities and a face-lift of infrastructure;

Concerned that on the 20th of November 2016, a strong windstorm substantially damaged parts of the Airport, including the arrival and departure lounges and the protective sheen of the buildings, with debris and wind-blown garbage littering the inside of the buildings thereby putting passengers, staff and other users of the airport in danger, especially when it rains as it often does;

Considering that the South-East is the last, among all the geo-political zones to have an international airport, this development is disheartening and it would not only expose users of the airport to harm, it would also discourage international airlines and interests from using the airport;

Worried that the current dilapidated state of the facilities and the infrastructure of the airport is a huge disincentive to the use of the airport, and endangers the lives of the people who use it, besides being a bad testament to the standard of infrastructure in Nigeria's critical aviation sector,

Accordingly resolves to:

Urge the Federal Ministry of Aviation, and other relevant authorities, to, as a matter of urgency, repair the damaged parts and renovate the facilities of the Akanu Ibiam International Airport and other airports in the Country requiring such attention to reduce the dangers of harm to which users of the airports are exposed.

4. Urgent Need to Complete the East/West Road, Especially, the Section Along Aba/Elem Road Junction to Onne Road Junction.

The Senate:

Aware that the construction of the 675km dual-carriageway East/West Road was awarded by the former President Olusegun Obasanjo in 2006 at the contract value of N211 billion;

Aware also that an additional 23.9km to link Calabar with the coastal town of Oron in Akwa Ibom State was included in the contract by former President Goodluck Jonathan making the Road accessible by all the major oil producing areas of the Niger Delta Region;

Recalls that the project could not commence in 2007, as it was not included in the 2007 Appropriation Act;

Acknowledges that during former President Yar'Adua's tenure nothing much could be achieved as a result of lack of engineering drawings for the project, which was eventually achieved;

Further Aware that former President Goodluck Jonathan after the production of engineering drawing revalidated the contract sum from N211 billion to N726 billion and re-awarded same to several contractors in sections I - V;

Worried that about eleven years from the date of contract award, the East-West Road, which was an outcome of negotiation with the agitating Niger Delta Youths, still suffers neglect and disdain by the government;

Particularly more worried about the section that links Aba Road to Onne Road junction in Rivers State, which links other parts of the country to multi-billion, multi-national investments, viz:

1. Port Harcourt Refinery 1
2. Port Harcourt Refinery 2
3. Indorama Petrochemicals
4. Notoire Fertilizer Company (former NAFCON)
5. Federal Ocean Terminal 1 and 2
6. Onne/Ikpokiri Oil and Gas Free zone
7. Nigeria Naval college;

Further Aware that this section of the road links Akwa Ibom and Cross River States to the East/West Road;

Understands that due to the concentration of the above-mentioned economic establishments, thousands of trailers, tankers and other heavy-duty machineries ply this section of the Road on daily basis for evacuation of products from these multi-national companies;

Observes that this section of the Road is completely in a state of disrepair, which has caused trailers and tankers to fall on regular basis, thus disrupting economic activities in the country;

Aware that at the inception of this administration Governor Nyesom Wike of Rivers State in collaboration with some of the multi-national companies carried out some remediation work to make the roads passable;

Observes that this effort was like a first aide on a major wound, as the pressure on the road did not take long to degenerate other sections of the road;

Recalls that Eleme youths in an attempt to draw the federal Government's attention to the level of dilapidation of the section of the road planned a no-thoroughfare- protest along that route, but the Rivers State government ably aborted the protest;

Recalls also that NUPENG planned to carry out a nation-wide protest by June 23, 2017, but for the intervention of the Governor of Rivers State, Chief Barrister Nyesom Wike, who again promised to carry out repairs at the various portions that had developed into gullies and death traps;

Worried that less than seven kilometres stretch of the bad section could delay a traveler for more than 4 hours and oftentimes exacerbate the agonies of fallen tankers and trailers;

Further worried that the nation could close her eyes from such a major Road that links its multi-billion Naira investments and multi-national infrastructures that is the life-wire of the nation's economy,

Accordingly Resolves to:

- i. *Urge* FERMA as a matter of urgency to intervene in the rehabilitation of the failed sections of the Aba Road/Eleme junction to Onne junction;
- ii. *Urge* the Ministry of Niger Delta to ensure the completion of the East/West Road particularly the section that links the multi-national investment within the 2017 budget year; and
- iii. *Direct* the Senate Committee on Niger Delta to ensure compliance with this resolution and report back within four weeks.

5. Occurrence of crisis in Sardauna Local Government Area of Taraba State

Notes with dismay the recent crisis resulting in massive destruction of lives, homes and properties - killing of cattle and other animals in the Sardauna Local Government Area;

Further Note that many settlements across the rural areas of the Local Government Area were attacked by some militia groups resulting in the death of hundreds of people, loss of thousands of cattle and properties worth millions of naira, while thousands of cattle were also rustled;

Aware that between the 17th and 25th June, 2017 communities of Mayo Ndaga, Dorofi, Hainare, Tamnya, Kwara Kwara, Chabbal Gudali, Wanji, Tamviya, Mbamnga and Bang Three Corner etc in Sardauna Local Government Area have been under serious attacks by the rampaging Militia;

Further aware that, due to the barbaric killings, wanton and arsenic destruction of settlements and other properties by the militia, many have been rendered homeless (thousands of women and children homeless) and are presently in various IDP camps in Nguroje, Gembu, Mayo Ndaga, Dorofi etc. in Nigeria and others as refugees in the Republic of Cameroon;

Concerned that the killing of any citizen of Nigeria under any guise amounts to serious violations of the right to life, right to security of persons, right to the respect of the dignity inherent in human beings, the right to property ownership, the right of animals to decent life not only guaranteed by the 1999 Constitution as amended, but also by the African charter on human and people's right and International convention on civil and political right to which Nigeria is a party;

Aware that of all the disturbing crises which occurred in Taraba State in the past, this is the most voracious, spontaneous, devastating and barbaric in terms of loss of lives, destruction of animals, human settlements and properties. The scene is gruesome and the numbers are staggering. Many lives have been lost, many cattle have been hacked, many others rustled and about a 100,000 persons displaced (mostly women, children and the elderly); not less than 18,000 as refugees in the Republic of Cameroon,

Accordingly resolves to:

- i. Observe a minute silence for the repose of the deceased victims of the brutal attacks;
- ii. Condemn these barbaric killings of innocent victims and wanton destruction of cattle and properties;
- iii. Urge the Federal Government to take urgent measures to secure and protect lives, animals & properties of the Citizens, and to also prevent further breakdown of Law and Order and such attacks on the innocent citizens in the Local Government Area;
- iv. Urge the Federal Government to set up a Judicial Panel to investigate the immediate and remote causes of the killings and destruction of lives and properties and identify the perpetrators with the aim of bringing them to justice;
- v. Urge the Federal Government to station a formidable Military Base, an active Police and Civil Defence presence and security surveillance in Sardauna Local Government Area of Taraba State;

- vi. Urge the Federal Government of Nigeria as a matter of urgency to direct National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) to provide relief materials to the survivors and their families now in Internally Displaced Persons (IDP) Camp;
- vii. Contact the Government of the Republic of Cameroon to determine the actual number of refugees and their animals in Cameroon;
- viii. Urge the Federal Government to use the UNHCR, National Commission for Refugees (NCR), Nigerians to consider the plight of the refugees in Cameroon and urgently arrange for their proper care, security and protection; and
- ix. Direct the Senate Ad-hoc Committee on Internal Crisis to determine all issues connected to the crisis through appropriate terms of reference, take a tour of the affected areas and conduct thorough assessment for further investigation into the remote and immediate causes of the crisis and report back within the next four (4) weeks.

6. Demise of Alhaji Yusuf Maitama Sule (Danmasanin Kano)

The Senate:

Notes with great sadness the passing to the great beyond of an elder statesman per excellence, Consummate Politician, Orator, Diplomat, Teacher, Parliamentarian and trail blazer Alhaji Yusuf Maitama Sule (Danmasanin Kano). The testimony of all concerning his person is that he was a pragmatic and ardent believer in consensus and fair play in statecraft and Nation building;

Also notes that Danmasanin Kano was born on 1st October, 1929 in Yola Quarters in Kano to simple and peasant parents. He was named Yusuf after the Father of Traditional title holder of Madaki of Kano, showing his family's closeness to the Traditional Institution of Kano;

Also notes that Danmasanin was enrolled in Shahuchi elementary school in 1937 by the then Madaki of Kano, Mamuda. Based on his display of rare intelligence, he was promoted to the middle school and was admitted into Kaduna College in 1943 at the age of 13, and got a teaching job in Kano Middle School in 1948 on completion of his studies in Kaduna College;

Notes that Danmasanin contested and won seat in the Parliament in 1954 from there he was made the Oil Minister and facilitated the establishment of the Nigerian National Oil Company that later became NNPC. The first refinery in Nigeria was also built when he was the Oil Minister amongst other facilities. Yusuf Maitama Sule served as a Commissioner in various ministries during the Government of Audu Bako under the Gowon Administration and Danmasanin was once the Chairman of the Public Complaint Commission in the course of his service to the Nation;

Notes that Danmasanin contested for the Presidency under the National Party of Nigeria (NPN) in 1979 and was defeated in the primaries by President Shehu Shagari and later served as Nigerian Permanent Representative to the United Nations where he chaired UN Committee against Apartheid and in 1983 served as Minister of National Guidance;

Observes that after retirement from public services, Yusuf Maitama Sule concentrated all his energy in Community Services, building national consensus, Conflict Resolutions and contribution to National Discuss and Debates. As a consummate Orator he led the voices of fairness, equity, justice, national political and economic stability, unity in diversity, international relations in various local, national and international fora. He was a great reservoir of Nigeria contemporary history, bridge builder, exponent of National Unity;

Notes that Danmasanin was a founding member of Arewa Consultative Forum and the Chairman of Northern Elders Forum. Late Yusuf Maitama Sule was a holder of the Danmasanin Kano, a traditional title that made him the Chief Custodian of Kano History and that entails intimate consultations on various traditional and national issues with the Emir of Kano;

Aware that the demise of this precious gem is not only a great loss to the people of Kano State and Nigeria in particular, but to all friends in Africa and International Community,

Accordingly resolves to:

- i. Observe a minute silence in honour of the late Alhaji Yusuf Maitama Sule (Danmasanin Kano);
- ii. Send a high powered delegation of the Senate to condole with the family of the late Danmasanin Kano, the people and Government of Kano State; and
- iii. Urge the Federal Government to immortalize him by naming a national monument after him.

CONSIDERATION OF BILLS

1. A Bill for an Act to make provisions for Mandatory Haemoglobin-Genotype Testing and for other connected matters thereto, 2017 (SB. 414) - *Second Reading*
