1. Demise of Chief Dr. Tony Okhakon Anenih *CFR: The Iyasele (The Prime Minister) of Esan People.*

Sponsor: Sen. Clifford A. Ordia (*Edo Central*)

The Senate:

Notes the time tested words of the legendary Martin Luther king, when he said: "An individual has not begun to live until he can rise above the narrow horizon of his particular individualist concerns to the broader concern of all humanity." This statement briefly defines the life and times of the man Chief Tony Okhakon Anenih who transited to eternal glory as announced by his family on the 28th day of October, 2018 at the ripe and fulfilled age of 85years;

Recalls that Tony Okhakon Anenih was born in Uzenema-Arue, a quarter in Uromi the Headquarters of Esan North East Local Government Area of Edo State on the 4th day of August, 1933;

Further recalls that Chief Tony Anenih despite his humble background, attended Government Primary School Uromi, and later joined the Nigeria Police Force in 1951 in Benin City after obtaining his Secondary School

Certificate. He was admitted into what was then known as the southern Police College Ikeja, now known as the Nigeria Police College, Ikeja. As one of the best trainees, he was selected for further training in Hendon Police Training School, United Kingdom in 1963, Branshill College, Basingstoke, Hampshire, England, 1966 and the International Police Academy, Washington D.C in 1970;

Aware that Chief Tony Anenih began his National Service when he served as a Police orderly to the first indigenous Governor General of Nigeria, Dr. Nnamdi Azikiwe. He served in various capacities all through the nooks and crannies of Nigeria as a fine officer and gentleman. He served the Nigeria Police Force meritoriously and retired voluntarily in 1976;

Aware that before venturing into Politics in 1979, Chief Tony Anenih established Chains of businesses ranging from super market, in Warri, Chemist in Benin City, Electronic shop in Enugu, sales of frozen meat in Bauchi, Oil Palm import and Car Mart. He was a successful businessman;

Recognizes that Chief Tony Anenih commenced his Political career as a sympathizer and financier of the defunct National Party of Nigeria (NPN) and rose to the position of the State Chairman of the Party in then Bendel State, now Edo and Delta. He was instrumental to the election of Dr. Samuel Osaigbovo Ogbemudia as Governor of Bendel State in 1983;

Recognizes further that Chief Tony Anenih joined other prominent and well-meaning Nigerians to form the then Social Democratic Party in 1991 where he once again brought his Political dexterity and tactics to bear for the election of Chief John Odigie Oyejuna as the Governor of Edo State. He later rose to the position of the National Chairman and did for Chief M.K.O Abiola what he did for Oyejuna in Edo State leading to the election of M.K.O Abiola as the President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria. However that election and the democratic process was unlawfully terminated by the then Military Administration;

Recognizes further that he served as a member of the Constitutional Conference which mandate, was to determine the way forward for Nigeria;

Recognizes further that Chief Tony Okhaikon Anenih was one of the few patriots of Nigeria who came together to form the People's Democratic Movement (PDM) which Later transformed to the People's Democratic Party (PDP) which won The 1999, 2003, 2007, 2011 general elections and which by the grace of God and the will of the Nigerian people shall win again in 2019;

Aware that Chief Tony Anenih served in different challenging capacity as one of the foremost Leaders in the party, a political colossus and a tactician, no wonder he deployed his compelling intelligence, strategies and uncommon tactics to ensure several victories for the party in Presidential, Governorship, National Assembly, State Houses of Assembly, Local Government Chairmen and Councilors across Nigeria, so much so that he was referred to as: "Mr Fix it." He indeed fixed Political and socio-economic problems. He served as the Chairman of Board of Trustees twice and was acknowledged and referred to as the National Leader of the party;

Mindful that Chief Tony Anenih as a result of his commitment and dedication to duty was generally accepted as a Leader. He earned the respect and friendship of all prominent Nigerian Leaders who called and referred to him as the National Leader. This, he attested to in his book "MY LIFE AND THE NIGERIA POLITICS" Where he said: 'My past records and antecedents shows clearly that I have always led well and those who I have led appreciated my Leadership qualities. If such people refer to me as Leader, of course I will accept it, it is by acceptance and not something I bought from the market.' He further said-I earned it. I did not buy it, I did not seize it or force it on people." Chief Tony Anenih until his death was truly a Political icon, uncommon Leader and pathfinder;

Notes that Chief Anenih was not only a loving husband and consummate father of all, he was a bridge builder, a detribalized Nigeria with uncommon courage, vision and capacity to deliver on promises. He was kind, truthful and above all very generous. He is never tired of giving either in cash or kind. In the course of his service to this Nation as a Politician and one time Honorable Minister of Works. Chief Tony Anenih have to his credit so many physical policies, plan and implemented projects which will endure beyond this generation. As a Minister, he accorded priority to road construction and maintenance of vital roads, to enhance economic growth and social interaction;

- The Eastern bypass in Kaduna;
- Rehabilitation of Minna Western Bye-Pass;
- Rehabilitation of Awka-Agulu Ekwulobia-Uga to Imo State Boarder;
- Rehabilitation of Abakaliki- Afikpo road, Ikob Abasi-Edet road;
- Auchie-ekpoma Agenibode road, Idah- Ayangba Road;
- Denkina-Shintaku road;
- Penyam-Shedan Road and host of others;
- Construction of 48 KM Lagos – Benin Bye pass;
- Construction of Ekpoma – Ilushi Road;
- Construction of Federal Secretariat, Benin City; and
- Establishment of National Institute of Construction Technology and Management Uromi etc.

Recounts his well-deserved honour, awards and recognition:

- Commander of the Order of Federal Republic (CFR);
- The Iyasele of Esanland (the Prime Minister of Esan People);
- Doctor of Law, *honoris Causa*, University of Benin;
- LL.D Degree, Igbinedion University, Benin;
- D.Sc. Honorary Degree, University of Science and Technology;
- D. Sc. Honorary Degree, Ambrose Alli University, Ekpoma; and
- Doctor of Agriculture (D.Agric.).

Contents that Late Chief Tony Anenih CFR was indeed a great and fearless man who served Nigeria and the entire humanity with all that he had. As a youth-he served, as a man-he served, at old age-he served, I am convinced he is serving even in death as humanity have something to learn from the life and times of this uncommon Nigerian and therefore deserves to be honored and recognized,

Accordingly Resolves to:

- i. *Observe* a minute Silence in his honour;
- ii. *Send* a high powered delegation of this hallowed chamber to pay a condolence visit to his family in Abuja and Uromi, and the people and government of Edo State;
- iii. *Accord* him all the official burial rites due such National figure who served with such honour and diligence; and
- iv. *Urge* the Federal Government to name the National Institute of Construction Technology and Management, Uromi after Late Chief Tony Anenih CFR.

2. The growing crises in the National Health Insurance Scheme (NHIS) And the National Primary Health Care Development Agency (NPHCDA).

Sponsor: Sen. Mao A. Oluabunwa (*Abia North*)

The Senate:

Aware of its constitutional role to periodically embark on oversight functions of the Ministries and Agencies of the Federal Government for the purpose of enthroning good governance, probity, reducing high-handedness of operators, eliminating corruption and improving overall efficiency;

Conscious that many of our Public Agencies today, have moved away from direct focus on serving the citizens, advancing economic and social development – to furthering impunity that border on personality cults, and these certainly run counter to the objectives of the Federal Government;

Further aware that major crises have been brewing at the NHIS over allegations of high-handedness, budget distortion, fraudulent cost manipulation, illegal investments and unprofessional manipulation of the human

Aware also that the same situation is also applicable in the NPHCDA - where the Executive Director has been accused of high-handedness, reckless spending in the purchase of unwanted vehicles, intimidation and unwarranted transfer of senior staff members without regards to due process;

Conscious of the fact that these unguarded executive and administrative processes pervading our Public Agencies, if not verified, checked and redirected for good, - the important roles of our Public Agencies in advancing the economic, social and general well-being of our citizens will be seriously impaired, and our nascent democracy will gradually lose its steam to emerging impunity of government appointed self-serving titans now looming large,

Accordingly resolves to:

Direct the Joint Senate Committee on Primary Health Care and Communicable Diseases and the Health Committee to wade into the emerging crisis of confidence and corruption in NPHCDA and NHIS, so as to thoroughly investigate the matter and other infractions, and inform the Senate of the findings within two weeks.

3. Rescission and Reconsideration of the Senate Approval of Virement/Supplementary Budget for Independent National Electoral Commission and Security Agencies for the Conduct of the 2019 General Elections.

Sponsor: Senator Danjuma Goje (*Gombe Central*) and 18 Others

The Senate:

Recall the approval of the Virement/Supplementary budget for INEC and Security Agencies for the conduct of the 2019 General elections in the sum of Two Hundred and Forty-Two Billion, Two Hundred and Forty-Five Million, Fifty Thousand, One hundred Naira [N242, 245, 050,100] only, which is to be funded from the Service Wide Votes on the 16th October, 2018-Senate Resolution (S/RS/027/04/8);

Aware that because of some obvious and imminent issues of national socio- economic importance, the virement/supplementary request cannot be implemented as earlier approved,

Accordingly resolves to:

- i. *Rescind and reconsider* its approval of the request as contained in resolution (S/RS/027/04/8) in line with Order 53(6) of its Standing Order;
- ii. *Approve* the sum of Two Hundred and Forty-Two Billion, Two Hundred and Forty-Five Million, Fifty Thousand, One hundred Naira [N242,245,050,100] only as reflected below:
