1. International Women's Day; Theme "Women in the changing world of work: Planet 50:50 by 2030".

The Senate:

Notes that March 8, is the International Women's day, a day that honours the achievements and calls attention to the rights of Women;

Further notes that the theme for this year's celebration is "Women in the Changing World of Work: Planet 50:50 by 2030" with particular focus on Women's empowerment. Many of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) specifically recognize the need to empower women as both an objective and a key to sustainable development;

Recalls that the International Women's day (IWD) was first officially recognized in 1911 and later recognized by the United Nations in 1975. In 1995, over 189 countries including Nigeria converged in Beijing, China for the 4th world conference on women and signed an action plan called "Beijing Declaration";

Observes that in 2015, world leaders adopted the sustainable development goals, placing gender equality and empowerment of all women and girls at the heart of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. This year's international Women's Day Focuses on Goal 8 of the SDGs: Decent Work and Economic Growth, which Challenges Governments around the World to achieve "Full and productive employment and Decent Work for all women, including young people and persons with disabilities, and equal pay for work of equal value.";

Further observes that achievement of goals including ending poverty, promoting inclusive and sustainable economic growth, reducing inequalities within and between countries, and achieving gender equalities and empowerment of all women and girls, rest upon unlocking the full potential of women in the world of work;

Aware that policies are needed to promote women's access to innovative technologies and practices, decent work and climate-resilient jobs and protect women from violence in work places;

Further aware that the "Violence against Persons Prohibition Act" (the VAPP Act) that was signed into law in 2015 is yet to be domesticated in any state of the federation; let alone implement;

Concerned that the implementation of policies that prohibits violence against women and girls are still very poor. Practices such as violence against women and girls in the public and private spheres, including trafficking, sexual and other types of exploitation, early child and forced marriage, female genital mutilation are still being practiced;

Further concerned that women often bear the burden of unpaid care and domestic work, and when these unpaid hours are added to salaried work, women actually work very long hours in both developing and developed countries;

Moreover women are also significantly under-represented as Legislators, Senior Government Officials and Corporate Chief Executive/Managers,

Accordingly resolves to:

- i. *Felicitate with Nigerian Women on this year's International Women's Day Celebration;*
- ii. *Call on Government at all levels to give women a quota in all elective offices; and*
- iii. *Mandate the Committee on Women Affairs to look into the Domestication of the Violence against Persons Prohibition Act in all the States of the Federation and report back to the Senate.*
