4. Petitions:

Sabi (*Niger North*) drew the attention of the Senate to a petition from Jegede Suzanne (Mrs) and Seventy others, against the Office of the Secretary to the Government of the Federation, over non-compliance with Presidential directive/selective implementation of scholarship awards for combined set of 2012, 2013 and 2014 President, National Youth Service Corp honours awardees. He urged the Senate to look into the matter.

- (ii) Rising on Rule 41, Senator Obinna J. Ogba (*Ebonyi Central*) drew the attention of the Senate to a petition from his constituent, Adonu C. Ogbonna, against Fidelity Bank Plc., over wrongful termination of his appointment. He urged the Senate to look into the matter.
