4. Petitions:

- (i) Rising on Rule 41, Senator Monsurat J. A. Sunmonu (*Oyo Central*) drew the attention of the Senate to a petition from her constituent, Teslim O. Adeleke, against the Department of Petroleum Resources (DPR), over his premature retirement. She urged the Senate to look into the matter.

Petition laid and accordingly referred to the Committee on Ethics, Privileges and Public Petitions [Rule 41(3)] to report within two (2) weeks.

- (ii) Rising on Rule 41, Senator Andrew I. Uchendu (*Rivers East*) drew the attention of the Senate to two (2) petitions from:
 - (a) Enyi Sinclair Esq. on behalf of Ascot Workers, against Asset Management Corporation of Nigeria (AMCON), over non payment of emoluments; and
 - (b) Aeropole Security Services Limited, against Asset Management Corporation of Nigeria (AMCON), over refusal to pay six months outstanding bills for security services rendered.

He urged the Senate to look into the matters.

- (iii) Rising on Rule 41, Senator Ovie A. Omo-Agege (*Delta Central*) drew the attention of the Senate to two (2) petitions from:
 - (a) Mr. Fidelix Ighosotu, against the Nigeria Army, over his verbal dismissal; and
 - (b) Mujakperuo N. Eriomala, against the Nigerian Customs Service, over short payment of monthly pension.

He urged the Senate to look into the matters.

5. Matter of Urgent Public Importance:

Rising on Rule 42, Senator Dino Melaye (*Kogi West*) drew the attention of the Senate to the clandestine bank account operated by the Nigerian National Petroleum Corporation (NNPC) which is not known to the Office of the Accountant-General of the Federation. He further informed the Senate that the said account has a balance of ₦31 billion by 2017 after different withdrawals. He sought and obtained the leave of the Senate to present the matter.

Matter to stand over to the next Legislative Day [Rule 42(2)].

6. Matter of Urgent Public Importance:

Rising on Rules 42 and 52, Senator Sabo Mohammed (*Jigawa South-West*) drew the attention of the Senate to the urgent need to halt the implementation of the new import duty tariff on imported Milk into the country. He sought and obtained the leave of the Senate to present the matter forthwith:

The Senate:

aware of the Federal Government's slogan for the diversification of the Nigerian economy by increasing agricultural production that currently contributes only 21% to GDP;

further aware that currently majority of dairy companies operating in Nigeria for decades are foreign owned and instead of establishing ranches and investing in milk production and dairy processing locally they are only interested in importing finished products from their parent companies overseas, thereby depriving Nigerians of employment opportunity;

notes that Nigeria import about \$1.5 billion dollar worth of dairy products into the country annually. If this amount can be channelled into the dairy industry, milk importation will be totally eliminated;

saddened that instead of Federal Government to assist local milk producers by increasing tariff on imported milk and protecting local industries, it is now killing the local dairy industries by reducing the import duty on powdered milk from 10% to 5% this makes it impossible for the local dairy industry to compete with imported milk;

aware that protecting local dairy industry by Federal Government is the only way to achieve self sufficiency in milk production as obtained in other countries, and with Nigerians young population of which about 45% are children age 15 and below, the age bracket for which milk consumption is most vital for healthy growth, the European Union and other milk products exporting countries heavily subsidize the livestock production and processing supply chains;

observes that the Minister of Agriculture at a function in Abuja sometime last year unveiled plans by Federal Government to reduce the importation of powdered milk by 2019 only for the Government to make a turn around to encourage its importation by reducing import duty from 10% to 5%; and

convinced that Nigeria should focus on avoiding the negative impact of importation of powdered milk into the country and put greater focus on involving local farmers in the value chain so that milk will be more available and processed into higher value products that everyone will benefit.

Accordingly resolves to:

- (i) urge the Federal Government to suspend the new tariff immediately;
- (ii) mandate the Committees on Agriculture and Rural Development; Finance; and Customs Excise and Tariff to invite the Ministries, MDAs and other relevant Stakeholders in the industry to investigate and provide a lasting solution to this important issue.

Rising on Rule 43, Senator Magnus N. Abe (*Rivers South-East*) expressed his appreciation to the Leadership of the Senate and the entire Senate for graciously attending his thanksgiving ceremony which took place in Port Harcourt on Sunday, 11th February, 2018. He explained that their presence was a mark of friendship and solidarity that was highly appreciated by the people of his Senatorial District and Rivers State in general.

J. Enang in The Nation Newspaper of Wednesday, 7th February, 2018. He expressed dismay over this attitude and urged them to submit the details within one (1) week.

Demise of Senator John Nanzip Shagaya OFR (2nd September, 1942 -11th February, 2018):

Motion made: That the Senate notes with heavy heart and a deep sense of loss, the demise of Senator John Nanzip Shagaya, former senior military officer who was involved in a ghastly motor accident on the Sunday, 11th February, 2018 while returning to Jos from Langtang;

notes also that Senator John Shagaya was born on September, 2nd 1942 to Mallam Sikji Miri Wazhi (alias SHAGAYA) and Mrs. Maryamu Zwancit. He attended Junior Primary School at Nyer, and Sudan United Mission Primary School, Langtang and later the Nigeria Military School (N.M.S) Zaria between 1960-1964;

notes further that Senator John Shagaya after graduation, was posted to 3 Marine Commando when he gained his commission as Second Lieutenant. He participated with the Marine Commando in the Nigeria Civil War (1967-1970). His later appointments included Grade Three staff officer-Nigeria Army School of Infantry, Jaji, Director of Cadets-Nigerian Defence Academy, Director-Armed Forces Command and Staff College, Jaji, Brigade Commander-9 Mechanized Infantry Brigade, Military Secretary-Army Headquarters, and General Officer Commanding-1st Mechanized Infantry Division;

aware that under the Military Government of General Ibrahim Babangida, Shagaya was Federal Minister of Internal Affairs, a member of the Armed Forces Ruling Council and a member of the Police Council. He also served as Chairman of the Committee set up in 1987 to decide on Nigeria's membership of the Organisation of the Islamic Conference (OIC);

aware also that through dint of hard work, dedication and commitment to professionalism, Senator John Nanzip Shagaya was appointed Field Commander in the ECOMOG Peacekeeping Force in Liberia in September 1993, relieving Brigadier-General Tunji Olurin;

notes that he was elected Senator on the platform of the People's Democratic Party (PDP) in April 2007 to represent Plateau South Senatorial District and served as the Vice Chairman, Committee on Solid Minerals. He sponsored the National Climate Change Commission Bill;

observes that Senator John Shagaya was a proud Awardee of National and several prestigious military awards such as:

- Officer of the Federal Republic (OFR);
- ECOWAS Distinguished Service Medal;
- Republic of Liberia's Distinguished Service Star Nigerian Armed Forces Medal;
- Distinguished Service Star;

aware that his demise is a great loss to the people of Plateau South Senatorial District in particular, Plateau State and Nigeria, and the West African sub-region at large; and

convinced that late Senator John Shagaya was indeed a great man who served Nigeria with everything he had. He gave his all both in his youth and old age to the service of Nigeria and thus deserves to be accorded the utmost national respect even in death.

Accordingly resolves to:

- (i) observe one minute silence in honour of the late Senator John Shagaya;
- (ii) send a delegation of this hallowed Chamber to condole with the family, the people and Government of Plateau State; and

- (iii) urge the Federal Government of Nigeria to immortalize Senator John Shagaya, by naming a National monument in his honour (*Senator Jeremiah T. Useni — Plateau South*).
