- (i) Rising on Rule 41, Senator Basssey A. Akpan (*Akwa Ibom North-East*) drew the attention of the Senate to a petition from his constituent, Sgt. Ekpo Bassey Force No. 371533, against the Nigeria Police, over his wrongful dismissal. He urged the Senate to look into the matter.
- Petition laid and accordingly referred to the Committee on Ethics, Privileges and Public Petitions [Rule 41(3)] to report within two (2) weeks.*

- (ii) Rising on Rule 41, Senator Jibrin I. Barau (*Kano North*) drew the attention of the Senate to a petition from Mrs J.R.I.M. Yahaya Kabo, against the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN), over her unlawful termination of appointment. He urged the Senate to look into the matter.

Matter of Urgent Public Importance:

Rising on Rules 42 and 52, Senator Dino Melaye (*Kogi West*) drew the attention of the Senate to the action of Kogi State Government by enacting a law creating Vigilante Group which contradicts Section 214 of the 1999 Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria (as amended). He stated that the scope of operation of this group is in conflicts with the functions of the military and other paramilitary establishment of Nigeria. He added that killings is ongoing in Okeke, Adavi and Lokoja. He informed the Senate that militia of Maitatsine in Kano and Boko Haram group in the North-East started in this form. He noted that the alleged ammunition impounded by the Nigeria Customs Service in the name of sports equipment belong to this illegal group.

Accordingly resolves to:

mandate the Committees on National Security and Intelligence; and Judiciary, Human Rights and Legal Matters to urge the National Security Adviser to investigate and advise the of the Federation with a view of disbanding this unconstitutional body.

10. Motion:***Demise of His Excellency, Alhaji Aliyu Akwe Doma (OON):***

Motion made: That the Senate notes with a deep sense of loss and absolute submission to the will of Almighty God, the passing away of the former Executive Governor of Nasarawa State, Alhaji Aliyu Akwe Doma (OON) Madauchin Doma whose death occurred on Tuesday, 6th March, 2018 after a brief illness in Israel;

notes also that the Late Alhaji Aliyu Akwe Doma, was born on the 1st of September, 1942 in Doma Local Government Area of Nasarawa State. He attended Doma Junior Primary School and Lafia Senior Primary School between 1951 and 1957;

notes further that Late Alhaji Aliyu Akwe Doma attended Government Secondary School, Kastina Ala and Higher Teacher Training College, Gombe, where he obtained Grade II Teachers' Certificate in 1963;

aware that he attended University of Ibadan from 1964 to 1966, the British Drama League, London, England 1968, and the World Tourism Organization Centre for Advanced Tourism Studies, Turin, Italy, 1973. Late Alhaji Aliyu Akwe Doma furthered his Education in Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria, in 1976, and Ambrose Ali University, Ekpoma in 2002, where he obtained his Master's Degree in Public Administration;

aware also that the Late Alhaji Aliyu Akwe Doma enjoyed an excellent career in the Civil Service of Northern Nigeria, Benue and Plateau States culminating in attaining the pinnacle as a Super-Permanent Secretary. While serving as a Permanent Secretary, he was drafted into politics by Late Chief Solomon Lar as his Deputy Governor from 1983 until 1984, when the military terminated the Second Republic;

observes that the highlights of his Civil and Public Service Career included but not limited to the fact that he was an outstanding cultural tourism manager and policy developer. He was the Artistic Director of the Nigeria Contingent to FESTAC 77. For a long period of time, he was the Chairman of the Centre for Black and African Civilization CBAC;

further observes that he was appointed a member of the Presidential Joint National Consultative and Advisory Committee of Traditional Rulers and Leaders of thought between 1995 and 1998, a member of the National Committee on the future of Higher Education in Nigeria, from 1996 to 1998;

recalls that he was appointed a Member of the Technical Committee of Presidential Council on Tourism in 2004. He held Private Sector Positions as Chairman of Integrated Tourism Consultants in 2003 and as a representative of Steyr Nigeria. Late Aliyu Akwe Doma capped his political career when he became the 2nd Executive Governor of Nasarawa State in 2007 on the platform of the People's Democratic Party (PDP) succeeding my Distinguished Colleague, Senator Abdullahi Adamu;

notes that Aliyu Akwe Doma cuts a father figure image in Nasarawa State being the arrow head in the movement and actualization of the creation of the State. He was concerned for the rapid development of the State and therefore famous for his 13-Point Development Agenda; agriculture being the priority to the extent that the State commenced exportation of yams to Europe;

notes also that above all, His Excellency Late Aliyu Akwe Doma will be most remembered for his dogged pursuit of peace and it is to his eternal credit that Nasarawa State did not witness any crisis throughout his four years of governance;

further notes that Aliyu Akwe Doma was a major influence in the politics of Nasarawa State and his influence will remain for many years to come because he left behind a huge army of political faithful and unwavering loyalists; and

condemns that the demise of this Cultural Guru, Astute Administrator, Political Icon and Traditional Title Holder of Okuba (Madauchi) of Doma was a great loss to the people of Nasarawa in particular and Nigeria in general. He was buried on Sunday, 11th March, 2018 in his home town Doma, Nasarawa State in accordance to Islamic rites.

(i) observe a minute silence in respect of the Late Alh. Aliyu Akwe Doma Former Governor of Nasarawa State; and

(ii) send a delegation to condole with the family, Government and the people of Nasarawa State over this great national loss (Senator Suleiman A. Adokwe — Nasarawa South).
