5. Personal Explanation:

Rising on Rule 43, Senator Emmanuel Bwacha (*Taraba South*) drew the attention of the Senate to the gruesome murder of Late Hon. Hosea Ibibi of the Taraba State House of Assembly. He stated that he was kidnapped on 30th December, 2017 at Takum town while on Christmas break. He further pointed out that ransom was paid by the family before the kidnappers took his life. The entire Taraba South Senatorial District are mourning his death. He urged the Senate to observe a minute silence in his honour.

One minute silence accordingly observed in honour of the deceased.

6. Matter of Urgent Public Importance:

Rising on Rule 42 and 52, Senator Shuaibu Lau Isa (*Taraba North*) drew the attention of the Senate to the conflict between herdsmen and farmers ravaging Lau Local Government Area of Taraba State. He sought and obtained the leave of the Senate to present the matter forthwith.

The Senate:

notes with serious concern the conflict between farmers and herdsmen especially in Lau Local government of Taraba State which has ravaged villages Communities, depriving persons of right to life, destruction of houses, and foodstuff among others;

observe that the conflict started from Numan in Adamawa State being a border community between Taraba and Adamawa and has affected other bordering communities;

worried that this conflict between farmers and nomadic cattle headsman is posing grave damager to National Security, harmonious communal life and national unity;

also notes that over 70 people were killed in the conflict; and

appeal that the Senate should intervene.

Accordingly resolves to,

- (i) Call on the Senate to send a high powered delegation to in conjunction with the State government resolve this conflict for a harmonious existence.
- (ii) Urge NEMA to as a matter of urgency intervene by providing relief material to affected communities.
- (iii) Urge the Federal government to deploy more Security Personnel-Police, Army, Civil Defence etc, to the affected area.
- (iv) Urge the Federal Government to mount a comprehensive surveillance of the border of Adamawa and Taraba State to proactively detect and deter further attacks.
