Wednesday, 1st November, 2017

1. The Senate met at 10:53 a.m. The Deputy Senate President read the Prayers.

2. **Votes and Proceedings:**

The Senate examined the Votes and Proceedings of Tuesday, 31st October, 2017.

Question was put and the Votes and Proceedings were approved.

4. **Personal Explanation:**

Rising on Rule 43, Senator Bala Ibn Na'Allah (*Kebbi South*) drew the attention of the Senate to the released report of the World Bank's Doing Business of Tuesday, 31st October, 2017 which Nigeria progressed from last year's position of 171 to 145 despite recession facing the country. He recalled that in September 2016, the Senate came up with what it called a 20-point solution agenda to assist the Executive arm of government in addressing the challenges and other fast tracking Bills to revive the Nigerian economy. He emphasised that he is proud of his Membership of the 8th Senate, thanked Senators for their selfless service and congratulated Mr. President, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces of the Federation, the National Assembly and Nigerians.

The Senate accordingly congratulates Nigerian Government and Nigerians.

Motion made: That the Senate do receive the Report of the Committee on Local and Foreign Debts on the Ogun State Development Policy Operation (DPO) loan of US\$350 million from the World Bank (*Senator Shehu Sani — Kaduna Central*).

Question put and agreed to.

7. Motion:

The Assent of the North East Development Commission Bill:

Motion made: That the Senate notes that the North East Development Commission Bill was passed by the National Assembly and assented to by Mr. President, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces of the Federation on Thursday, 26th October, 2017;

notes also that the assent to the Bill marks the establishment and take-off of the North East Development Commission to among other things:

- a. Receive and manage funds allocated by the Federal Government and international donor agencies for the resettlement, rehabilitation, integration and reconstruction of roads, houses and business premises of victims of insurgency as well as tackling the menace of poverty and environmental challenges of the area;
- b. Coordinate projects and programmes within the master plan for the rehabilitation, resettlement, reconciliation, reconstruction and sustainable development of the North East Zone in the fields of infrastructure, human and social services, including health and nutrition, education and water supply, agriculture, wealth creation and employment opportunities, urban and rural development; and poverty alleviation;
- c. Liaise with Federal Ministries, Departments and Agencies, States and Development partners on the implementation of all measures approved in the master plan for the stabilization and development of the North East by the Federal Government among others;
- d. Assess and report on any project being funded or carried out in the North East by any Federal Ministry, Department and Agency or company that has an agreement with the Federal Government, and ensure that funds released for such projects are properly utilized;
- e. Liaise with other stakeholders on the tackling of humanitarian, ecological and environmental problems and degradation that may arise from natural causes, insurgency and industrial activities in the North East Zone. Seek humanitarian, human, material, technical and financial support from Development partners (local or international) and Non-governmental organisations with a view to developing the North East Zone;
- f. Co-ordinate civil-military confidence building and stabilization measures and also activities that lie within the civil-military interface especially before, during and after military and security operations; and act as the focal point to coordinate and harmonise all other intervention programmes and initiatives that the Federal Government is involved with in the North East Zone.

aware that the establishment of the Commission (NEDC) is a direct response by this administration to address the widespread devastation inflicted on the zone by the activities of the Boko-Haram insurgents which has been around for the past 8 years;

aware also that the Commission will provide an institutional framework that will ensure transparency, accountability and prudent management of funds that will build the confidence of Donor Agencies and Foundations towards assisting and funding projects of the Commission;

observes that the Commission will end the huge humanitarian crisis in the North East that no other Committee or institution could have done within the short and long term; and

convinced that as an institution backed by law, the commission would remain the biggest succour for people of the region that is adjudged to be one of the poorest regions even before the advent of the Boko-Haram crisis because their lives would be rebuilt through its activities.

According resolves to:

- (i) commend Mr. President, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces of the Federation for his assent to the North East Development Commission Bill and commitment to the plight of the North East Region;
- (ii) commend the Senate President, the leadership of the Senate; and Distinguished Senators for their support which would see to the restoration of normal life in the Northeast;
- (iii) urge the Federal Government to make adequate financial provisions in the 2018 Budget for the Commission's appropriate take-off; and
- (iv) urge the Donor Agencies to continue to support the North East through the newly established Commission (*Senator Ahmad I. Lawan — Yobe North*).

Motion made: That a Bill for an Act to establish the Nigerian Tax Academy in order to provide training, develop standard curriculum for continuing education of tax administrators and collectors to facilitate effective service delivery and for Other Related Matters, 2017 be read the Second Time (*Senator Aliyu A. Sabi — Niger North*).
