4. Petitions:

- (i) Rising on Rule 41, Senator Shehu Sani (*Kaduna Central*) drew the attention of the Senate to a petition from Comrade Wordam Simdik on behalf of Coalition of Closed Unpaid Textile Workers, Kaduna, against five(5) Textiles Companies, over non payments of their emoluments. He urged the Senate to look into the matter.

Petition laid and accordingly referred to the Committee on Ethics, Privileges and Public Petitions [Rule 41(3)] to report within two (2) weeks.

- (ii) Rising on Rule 41, Senator Dino Melaye (*Kogi West*) drew the attention of the Senate to a petition from R. S. John Esq. on behalf Mr Amadi Victor and three (3) others, against the Nigerian Ports Authority (NPA), over wrongful termination of their appointments. He urged the Senate to look into the matter.

- (iii) Rising on Rule 41, Senator Foster Ogola (*Bayelsa West*) drew the attention of the Senate to a petition from his constituent, Comrade Oyinemi D. Bekekeme, Chairman, Ijaw Youths Council, against the Nigeria Police, over his assault. He urged the Senate to look into the matter.

- (iv) Rising on Rule 41, Senator Hassan Mohammed (*Yobe South*) drew the attention of the Senate to a petition from his constituent, Musa A. Ibrahim NN Service No. 4868, against the Nigerian Navy, over posting and unpaid salaries. He urged the Senate to look into the matter.

- (v) Rising on Rule 41, Senator Clifford A. Ordia (*Edo Central*) drew the attention of the Senate to a petition from his constituent, Commander Lucky Anetor, PhD, against the Nigerian Navy, over non acceptance of his resignation letter. He urged the Senate to look into the matter.

5. Personal Explanation:

Rising on Rule 43, Senator Suleiman A. Adokwe (*Nasarawa South*) drew the attention of the Senate to the World Radio Day celebrated on 13th February, 2018 to mark the importance of Radio in educating, entertaining and enlightening the populace. He used this opportunity to felicitate and commend all radio stations in the country for their continued reach to Nigerians on many laudable government policies. He urged the National Assembly to adequately fund Radio Nigeria to acquire equipment to meet the challenges of the modern digital programmes.

6. Personal Explanation:

Rising on Rule 43, Senator Jibrin I. Barau (*Kano North*) drew the attention of the Senate to the adopted Report of his Committee on Tertiary Institutions and TETFUND on modality of establishing Tertiary Institutions across Nigeria. Regrettably, requests on these have continued unabated. The report ought to have guided the subsequent agitations. He urged the Committee on Rules and Business to comply with the provisions of the report.

By the leave of the Senate, the Committee on Rules and Business was mandated to synergise with the Committee on Tertiary Institutions and TETFUND regarding the upgrading or establishment of Tertiary Institutions in Nigeria.

Omo-Agege (*Delta Central*) drew the attention of the Senate to Tuesday, 20th February, 2018, Senate Resolution on the Press Conference he granted over the amendment to the Electoral Act, which was subsequently referred to the Committee on Ethics, Privileges and Public Petitions. He tendered an unreserved apology to the Leadership and entire Senate over his press interview which impugned on the privileges of Senators.

Motion made: That a Bill for an Act to amend the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) Act CAP C4 LFN 2004 and for Related Matters, 2018 (*Senator Samuel N. Anyanwu — Imo East*).

Bill accordingly read the Second Time and referred to the Committee on Banking, Insurance and Other Financial Institutions to report within Four (4) weeks.

18. Medical and Dental Practitioners Act 1988 (Repeal and Re-Enactment) Bill, 2018 (SB.497):

Motion made: That a Bill for an Act to repeal the Medical and Dental Practitioners Act 1988 and establish the Medical and Dental Council of Nigeria for the Registration of Medical practitioners and Dental Surgeons and to provide for a disciplinary Tribunal for the discipline of members and Related Matters Thereto, 2018 (*Senator Adamu M. Aliero — Kebbi Central*).

19. National War College Act CAP N82 LFN 2004 (Amendment) Bill, 2018 (SB.551):

Motion made: That a Bill for an Act to amend the National War College Act CAP N82 LFN 2004 to provide for change of name to National Defence College and Other Connected Purposes, 2018 (*Senator Hope O. Uzodinma — Imo West*).

Debate:

Question put and agreed to.

Bill accordingly read the Second Time and referred to the Committee on Defence to report within Four (4) weeks.

20. Educational Policy Bill, 2018 (SB.332):

Motion made: That a Bill for an Act to translate and expand the educational policy of the Federal Republic of Nigeria on access to educational services by institutionalizing Open Distance Learning in collaboration with National Universities Commission and National Board for Technical Education and for Related Matters, 2018 (*Senator Aliyu S. Abdullahi — Niger North*).

Debate:

Question put and agreed to.

Bill accordingly read the Second Time and referred to the Committee on Tertiary Institutions and TETFUND to report within Four (4) weeks.

21. Federal Polytechnic Item (Establishment, etc.) Bill, 2018 (SB. 520):

Motion made: That a Bill for an act to establish the Federal Polytechnic Item to provide full-time courses in technology, applied science management and other fields of studies and to make provisions for the general administration of the polytechnic, 2018 (*Senator Mao A. Ohuabunwa — Abia North*).

Debate:

Question put and agreed to.

Bill accordingly read the Second Time and referred to the Committee on Tertiary Institutions and TETFUND to report within Four (4) weeks.

22. Sheriffs and Civil Process Act CAP S56 LFN 2004 (Amendment) Bill, 2018 (SB.599):
