5. Valedictory Session:

Demise of Late Senator Malam Ali Wakili (Bauchi South) (12th February, 1960 - 17th March, 2018):

Motion made: That the Senate notes with grief the Demise of Senator Malam Ali Wakili, Mni on Saturday, 17th March, 2018;

notes also that Late Senator Ali Wakili, an indigene of Bauchi State was born on 12th February, 1960. He attended Lere Primary School in Tafawa Balewa Local Government Area of Bauchi State from 1965 to 1972 from where he proceeded to Government Secondary School Damaturu in the then Borno State, from 1972 to 1977, where he obtained his Senior School Certificate;

observes that from 1977 to 1979, Late Senator Ali Wakili attended Bauchi College of Arts and Science and subsequently proceeded to Bayero University, Kano for his Degree Course, graduating in 1982. He also attended the Nigerian Customs Training School, Lagos in 1984 and thereafter rose to the position of Comptroller of Customs in 1996 and retired in 2009;

aware that Senator Ali Wakili, a retired Comptroller of Customs, contested for the Bauchi South Senatorial seat and won during the 2015 elections to represent Bauchi South Senatorial District;

notes that he had Legislative interests in Finance, Revenue, Appropriations, Security, Works, Agriculture and Education. He also had interest in making good legislation, empowerment of the people and good governance by sponsoring the following Bills and Motions: -

- Federal College of Education Dass (Establishment, etc.) Bill, 2018;
- Nigeria Customs Service Act (Repeal and Re-Enactment) Bill, 2018;
- Federal Medical Centres Bill, 2018;

- Nigerian Customs Service Pension Board (Establishment, etc.) Bill, 2018; and
- Compulsory, Free Universal Basic Education Act (Amendment) Bill, 2018;

Motions:

- Pandemic rise of road traffic accidents in Nigeria;
- Urgent need to re-organize and re-position Nigerian Postal Service (NIPOST) for optimal performance;
- Urgent need for value orientation and re-introduction of History as a course of study in the nations educational sector;
- Urgent need to review the implementation status of Nigeria Automotive Industry
 Development Plan;
- Urgent need to investigate special funds accrued to the federation as provided by the Revenue Allocation Act 2004;
- Urgent need for pro-active steps to nip in the bud the reported outbreak of Monkey Pox
 Disease in Nigeria; and
- Commemoration of the United Nations International Day for the Eradication of Poverty 17th
 October, 2017;

observes that the Late Senator Ali Wakili as Chairman of the Senate Committee on Poverty Alleviation, demonstrated intelligence, hard work and commitment in the advancement of legislative process;

observes that the Late Senator Ali Wakili believed in friendship. He celebrated friendship. He was a faithful devotee to the cult of humanity. His love for fellow human beings was extra-ordinary. He had passion for life and lived it to the fullest. He believed in fairness, equity and justice. He never believed in coveting anything that was not his. A friend's problem automatically became his and all his life, he strove to be a friend in need. He would plead to lend a helping hand even when you were reluctant to involve him in your personal problems;

observes also that Late Senator Malam Ali Wakili was a charismatic politician and political leader with passion and flavour that traversed the political spectrum, appealing to all social strata. He was at home with the grassroots as he was with the elite;

notes that Late Senator Malam Ali Wakili was a very generous man who gave his all to the needy, friends and constituents. Thousands benefitted from his social empowerment programmes;

further notes that he was a loyal party member and a team player who was determined to help realize the progressive agenda of the party and the administration in both Bauchi State and the whole country through legislation;

convinced that his death is very painful and a big blow to us all. He is leaving a void in the Senate of the Federal Republic, Bauchi politics and his community in Lere that will be hard to fill. We give thanks to the Almighty God for the fruitful and exemplary life that Late Senator Malam Ali Wakili lived;

He had that fire in him, that zeal, to create better living conditions for his people and indeed all Nigerians. This is evidenced in the various Awards of Excellence bestowed on him by different organizations during his time with us here, (Arewa Journalists Forum award and ors). He was relentless in fighting for the implementation of poverty alleviation projects and was most outspoken in his quest to return sanity to the system.

Senator Wakili's memory will live long in the hearts of men. He was a selfless leader, a patriotic politician, a rare breed who detested oppression; and was ever ready to stand undeterred, in the face of public criticism to fight against corruption and injustice.
