***PRESIDENTIAL DECISION TO DECLINE ASSENT TO NIGERIA PEACE CORPS
(ESTABLISHMENT) Bill, 2017 RECENTLY PASSED BY THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY***

Pursuant to Section 58(4) of the Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria 1999 (as amended), I hereby convey to the Senate, my decision, on 25th January, 2018 to decline Presidential Assent to the Nigerian Peace Corps (Establishment) Bill, 2017 recently passed by the National Assembly.

2. Specifically, reasons for the decision to decline assent to this Bill include among others:
- a. Security concerns regarding the proposed Nigerian Peace Corps being authorized to undertake activities currently being performed by extant security and law enforcement agencies; and

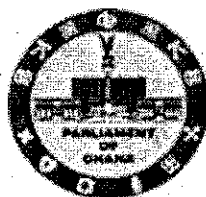
- b. *Financial implications of funding the establishment and operations of the proposed Nigerian Peace Corps, given the scarce financial resources may pose serious challenge to the Government.*

The Senate President acknowledged the presence of the following who were at the gallery to observe Senate Proceedings:

- (i) Staff and Students of Premier International School, Wuse II, Abuja;

5. Personal Explanation:

Rising on Rule 43, Senator Mohammed Hassan (*Yobe South*) drew the attention of the Senate to the alleged double Voters Card registration by the Governor of Kogi State by Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) in which three (3) staff of the Commission were sacked. He further stated that recently, the media reported that the Governor re-register in another ward in Kogi State. He urged the Committee on Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) to investigate the matter.

The Senate mandated the Committee on Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) to investigate, and report to Senate accordingly.

6. Privileges:

Rising on Rule 14, Senator Dino Melaye (*Kogi West*) drew the attention of the Senate to the alleged resumption of the Executive Secretary of National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) to office, a nominee of Mr. President, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces of the Federation without the confirmation of the Senate. He emphasised that this action was further confirmed by Thisday Newspaper of Monday, 27th February, 2018, Captioned "AGF dares Senate, asks Ojukwu to resume office as NHRC Boss without confirmation". He further observed that the Attorney-General of the Federation (AGF) has breached the 1999 Constitution as amended by playing the role of the Senate, thereby impugned on his privilege as a Senator. He urged the Senate to investigate the matter.

By leave of the Senate, Chairman, Committee on Judiciary, Human Rights and Legal Matters was mandated to investigate the matter. Also directed the Senate Leader to interface with the Secretary to Government of Federation (SGF) on the same issue.

7. Personal Explanation:

Rising on Rule 43, Senator Sunny O. Ogbuoji (*Ebonyi South*) drew the attention of the Senate to the delay at preparing 2018 Budget, which was due to lack of response from Parastatals and Agencies of Government regarding their respective Budget defence in the National Assembly. He urged the Senate to approved a deadline for their submissions.

By the leave of the Senate, Friday, 9th March, 2018 was accordingly approved for all pending 2018 Budget submissions.

8. Petitions:

- (i) Rising on Rule 41, Senator Abdullahi A. Sabi (*Niger North*) drew the attention of the Senate to a petition from his constituents, Mr. U. K. Abubakar on behalf of Former Power Holding Company of Nigeria (PHCN) Staff Forum, against the Nigeria Electricity Liability Management Company (NELMCO), over bulk rent allowance and emoluments. He urged the Senate to look into the matter.

Petition laid and accordingly referred to the Committee on Ethics, Privileges and Public Petitions [Rule 41(3)] to report within two(2) weeks.

- (ii) Rising on Rule 41, Senator Samuel O. Egwu (*Ebonyi North*) drew the attention of the Senate to a petition from his constituents, Chidi Egede -Ex-2003NA/54/5792, against the Nigerian Army, over his wrongful dismissal. He urged the Senate to look into the matter.

Petition laid and accordingly referred to the Committee on Ethics, Privileges and Public Petitions [Rule 41(3)] to report within two(2) weeks.

- (iii) Rising on Rule 41, Senator Jeremiah T. Useni (*Plateau South*) drew the attention of the Senate to a petition from Dr. F. Nmungwun on behalf of Foisi Broadcasting Network Nigeria Limited, against the Nigerian Export-Import Bank (NEXIM), over loan facility offer. He urged the Senate to look into the matter.
