4. Petitions:

- (i) Rising on Rule 41, Senator Mao A. 5. Personal Explanation:

Rising on Rule 43, Senator Shehu Sani (*Kaduna Central*) drew the attention of the Senate to the request by Mr. President, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces of the Federation for the confirmation of nominees of Board of the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN). He informed the Senate that the Central Bank of Nigeria as at today is the only Central Bank in the whole of Africa without a Board, this limits the functions and performance of such an important financial institution which has vital role to play in the nation's financial policies. He appealed to the Senate to passionately look into this issue and screen the Board of the CBN so that the apex bank can exercise its role effectively and efficiently.

10. Motion:

The Twin Bomb Blast in Mubi and the need for immediate action to prevent recurrence:

Motion made: That the Senate notes that on Tuesday, 1st May, 2018 two suspected suicide bombers shattered the relative peace in Mubi and its environs through a Twin bomb explosion at a Mosque within the popular second-hand clothes market known as Kasuwan Yan Gwonjo. Over Twenty-Nine (29) innocent people were officially confirmed dead but the grave diggers said they buried Eighty-Five (85) people and over Fifty (50) others were hospitalized and some in critical conditions, while properties worth millions of Naira were also destroyed;

aware that the recent attacks have seriously brought back fears not only in Mubi but the entire Adamawa North Senatorial District and this will definitely affect businesses of the area especially Mubi being a commercial centre of Adamawa State;

further notes the prompt response by the two Chairmen of Mubi North and South Local Government Areas in evacuating victims and providing immediate medical services and ambulances which evacuated seriously injured victims to the Federal Medical Centre, Yola;

also notes the action taken by the State Government to take care of treatment of victims of the attack; and

appreciates the directives given by the Vice President to the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) to provide relief materials to victims and the visit of the Chief of Army staff to Mubi on Sunday, 6th May, 2018 to assess the security situation in the area.

Accordingly resolves to:

- (i) condemn this dastardly act;
- (ii) observe a minute silence for the repose of the souls of the deceased;
- (iii) urge the Security Agencies especially the Nigerian Army, Airforce, Nigeria Police, Directorate of State Services (DSS) and Nigerian Immigration Service to beef up security in Mubi and the entire Adamawa North Senatorial Zone;
- (iv) urge the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) and Presidential Committee on North East Initiative (PCNI) to as a matter of urgency provide relief materials to the affected community as directed by the Vice President;
- (v) urge the National Orientation Agency, Traditional Councils, Local Government Councils to intensify enlightenment campaign and synergy between the Security Agencies/traditional institution in ensuring adequate security in the Senatorial Zone; and
- (vi) mandate the Committees on Army; National Emergency and Disaster Preparedness and Internally Displaced Persons, Refugees and Initiatives on North East to monitor implementation of the resolutions (*Senator Binta Masi Garba — Adamawa North*).

The Senate President reported that the Senate in a Closed Session deliberated on the non appearance of the Inspector General of Police (IGP) before the Senate in Plenary after series of invitations;

The Senate notes that this is disrespect to the Institution and constituted authority;

The Senate also notes his earlier refusal to appear before the *Ad hoc* Committee Investigating the various allegations leveled against the Police, Inspector General of Police and Police Service Commission which was overruled by Court of competent jurisdiction;

The Senate viewed his present refusal as danger to democracy;

Therefore, the Senate resolved to declare Ibrahim Kopotum Idris, the Inspector General of Police (IGP), as enemy of democracy and unfit to hold any public office within and outside Nigeria; and

The leadership of the Senate was mandated to look into the matter for further necessary action.
