- (i) Rising on Rule 41, Senator Mao A. Ohuabunwa (*Abia North*) drew the attention of the Senate to a petition from St. Matthew's Church, Gwarimpa, Abuja over a sixteen year land issue involving the Federal Housing Authority (FHA) and the Federal Capital Development Authority (FCDA). He urged the Senate to look into the matter.
