An Act to confer exclusive original jurisdiction in the Federal Capital Territory, Abuja, on Chieftaincy Matters on the Customary Court of Appeal of the Federal Capital Territory, Abuja; and for related matters.

Commencement

ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria —

1. Subject to section 267 of the Constitution, the Customary Court of Appeal of the Federal Capital Territory Abuja, shall-

Jurisdiction of customary court of appeal to determine chieftaincy dispute

- (a) exercise appellate and supervisory jurisdiction in proceedings where the subject matter of the claim is on, or relates to customary law; and
- (b) have exclusive original jurisdiction in the Federal Capital Territory, Abuja to hear and determine dispute on or relating to Chieftaincy matters.
- 2. Section 12 of the Chiefs (Appointment and Deposition) (Federal Capital Territory) Act is repealed.

3. In this Act---

Interpretation.

"Constitution" means the Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, 1999;

"Customary Court of Appeal" means the Customary Court of Appeal of the Federal Capital Territory, Abuja.

**4.** This Act may be cited as the Customary Court of Appeal of the Federal Capital

Territory Abuja (Jurisdiction on Chieftaincy Matters) Act, 2011.
