

SENATE OF THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF NIGERIA

VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS

Wednesday, 4th March, 2020

1. The Senate met at 10:46 a.m. The President of the Senate read prayers.

2. Votes and Proceedings:

The Senate examined the Votes and Proceedings of Tuesday, 3rd March, 2020.

Question was put and the Votes and Proceedings were approved.

3. Announcement:

4. Petition:

Rising on Rule 41, Senator Robert A. Boroffice (Ondo North) drew the attention of the Senate to a petition from Samuel A. Ayesa & Co. on behalf of Cpl. Festus Ilegbusi, Force No. 202843, against the Nigeria Police over his wrongful dismissal. He urged the Senate to look into the matter.

Petition laid and accordingly referred to the Committee on Ethics, Privileges and Public Petitions [Rule 41(3)] to report within two (2) weeks.

5. Personal Explanation:

Rising on Rule 43, Senator Emmanuel Bwacha (*Taraba South*) drew the attention of the Senate to the incident that happened few days ago between the Survey Department of Federal Ministry of Works and Housing; and armed bandit along Mararaba-Donga road in Taraba South Senatorial District. He stated that the team of surveyors were on Federal Projects Survey when they suddenly ran into armed bandits carrying AK 47 rifles on numerous motorcycles; the military escort responded immediately with several gunshots. He expressed that this has further heighten tension among the communities.

He urged Taraba State and other States Government in the Federation to engage alternative security outfit, e.g. 'Amotekun' in the South West and Niger State model to compliment the Nigerian Military.
