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ORDER OF THE DAY

BILL

1. A Bill for an Act to authorise the issue from the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Federation the total sum of ₦13,082,420,568,233 (Thirteen Trillion, Eighty-Two Billion, Four Hundred and Twenty Million, Five Hundred and Sixty-Eight Thousand, Two Hundred and Thirty-Three Naira) only, of which ₦484,488,471,273 (Four Hundred and Eighty-Four Billion, Four Hundred and Eighty-Eight Million, Four Hundred and Seventy-One Million, Two Hundred and Seventy-Three Thousand Naira) only is for Statutory Transfers, ₦3,344,380,000,000 (Three Trillion, Three Hundred and Forty-Four Billion, Three Hundred and Eighty Billion Naira) only is for Debt Service, ₦5,649,872,137,888 (Five Trillion, Six Hundred and Forty-Nine Billion, Eight-Hundred and Seventy-Two Million, One Hundred and Thirty-Seven Thousand, Eight Hundred and Eighty-Nine Naira) only is for Recurrent (Non-Debt) Expenditure while the sum of ₦3,603,679,959,070 (Three Trillion, Six Hundred and Three Billion, Six Hundred and Seventy-Nine Million, Nine Hundred and Fifty-Nine Thousand, Seventy

Naira) only is for contribution to the Development Fund for Capital Expenditure for the year ending 31 December, 2021 (HB.1069) (*Leader*) – (*First Allotted Day*) – *Second Reading*.

MOTION

2. Commemoration of the International Day on Disaster Risk Reduction

The House:

Notes that the International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction started in 1989 after a call by the United Nations General Assembly for a day to promote a global culture of risk–awareness and disaster reduction strategies;

Also notes that the 13 October of every year is celebrated to focus on how people, Institutions and Communities around the World plan to reduce exposure to disasters and awareness about the importance of reining in the risks that they may face;

Further notes that in 2015 at the 3rd UN World Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction in Sendai, Japan, the International Community was reminded the impact of disasters with the potential to cause loss of lives and great social and economic upheaval, displacing millions of people every year;

Aware that disasters, are exacerbated by man–made, climate change and natural factors which have negative impact on investment in sustainable development and the desired outcomes;

Recalls that this year's celebration brings to limelight the role of the Nigerian Centre for Disease Control (NCDC) and the Presidential Task Force (PTF) using risk reduction initiatives in the management of COVID–19 pandemics and protocol follow up strategies;

Also aware that this year's International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction is about governance, as strategic funding and institutional action plans are put in place, to measure good disaster risk governance in terms of lives saved, reduced number of people affected by disaster and reduced economic losses;

Further aware that COVID–19 pandemic and the climate change emergencies suggest the need for clear vision, plans and empowered institutions to act on the scientific evidences for public good;

Worried that the Laws establishing some strategic organs of government that should address Disaster Risk Reduction at National and Local levels have become moribund, thereby hindering new initiatives and public private partnerships drive, such as Rivers Basin Authorities, Fire Service, Federal Inland Water Ways Authority, Local Government Markets Management;

Believes that in commemoration of this year's International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction, there is urgent need to call on Government Agencies, Private Development Partners and other relevant stakeholders to initiate actions and policy frameworks for strategic Disaster Risk Reduction in Nigeria;

Resolves to:

- (i) Urge the Federal Government to develop short term and long term action plans that will spur the political will, at addressing the national and local strategies for Disaster Risk Reduction as adopted by UN Member States at the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction in 2015;
- (ii) mandate the Committee on Legislative Compliance to ensure Implementation and report back within four (4) for further legislative action.
