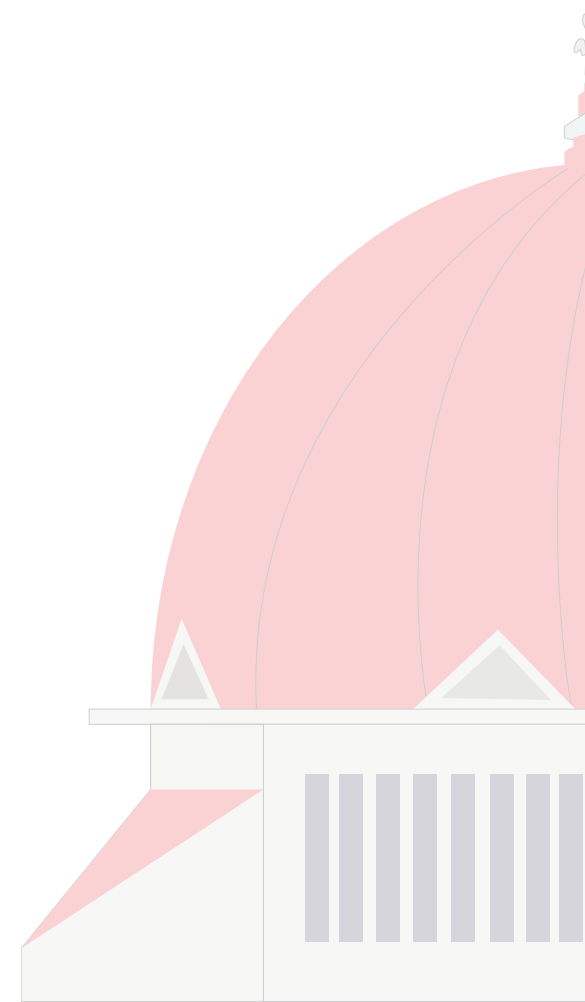


# Introduction

Since November 2017, Policy and Legal Advocacy Centre (PLAC) has supported the engagement of the Senate Committee on Ethics, Privileges and Public Petitions with Nigerian citizens who have grievances against Ministries, Departments and Agencies of government (MDAs).

The Senate Committee on Ethics, Privileges and Public Petitions receives petitions from members of the public who have suffered administrative injustices by MDAs and seek redress by its Committee. While the Committee is largely restricted to fact finding, its recommendations may be enforced if adopted as Resolutions by the Senate chamber.

This publication seeks to enrich the existing body of knowledge of the Senate Petitions Committee whose work has progressively increased to include petitions against private organisations /respondents in breach of citizens' fundamental rights. It is hoped that the analysis provided on the Committee's work and 8th Assembly's Resolutions will be used to further strengthen citizen engagement and democratic accountability.

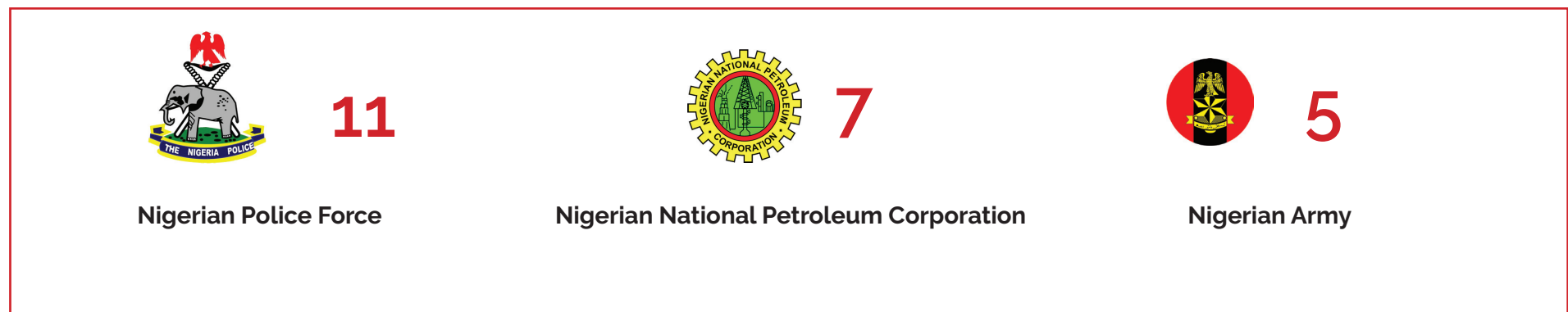
## Analysis on Senate Resolutions in the 1st Session

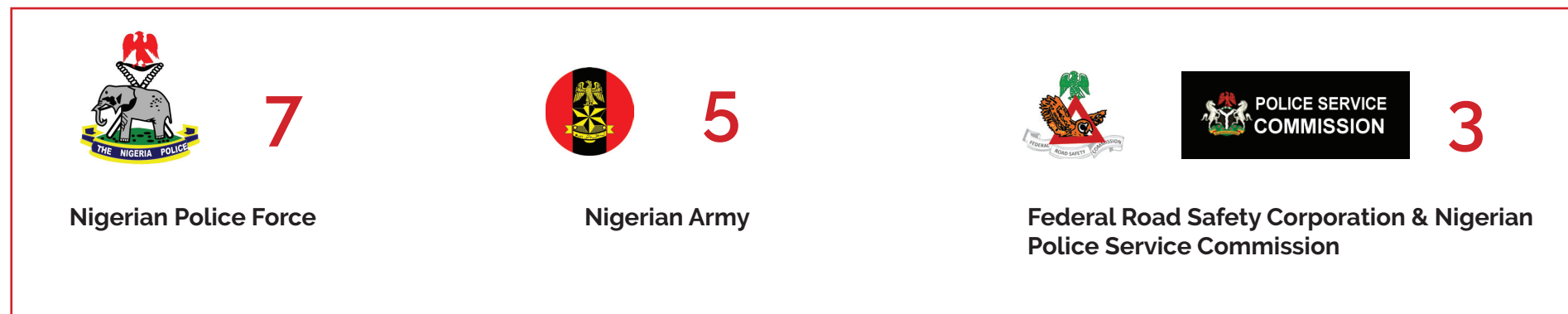

- The total number of petitions dropped to 206 due to the omission of number 114, as well as the merger of petitions number 146 and 169, which are the same petition and were brought twice.
- Some petitions were brought against a private individual and an MDA. See petition number 14 - CAC and Engr. Akinbiyi E. , petition number 16, University of Abuja and Mr. Samuel .O. Adam and petition number 40, Fidelity bank and Military Pensions Board .
- The respondent column is blank in petition number 47 and petition number 77 from the electronic records of the Committee.
- Petition number 48, (which is against the Switzerland Government), petition number 55, (WAEC) and petition number 62, (Goningen Airport, Netherlands) were not classified as MDAs or private respondents.
- Petition number 153, which was against the Acting Director-General of the Directorate of Technical Corporation in Africa (GTCN) and Ministry of Foreign Affairs were classified as been brought against one MDA.

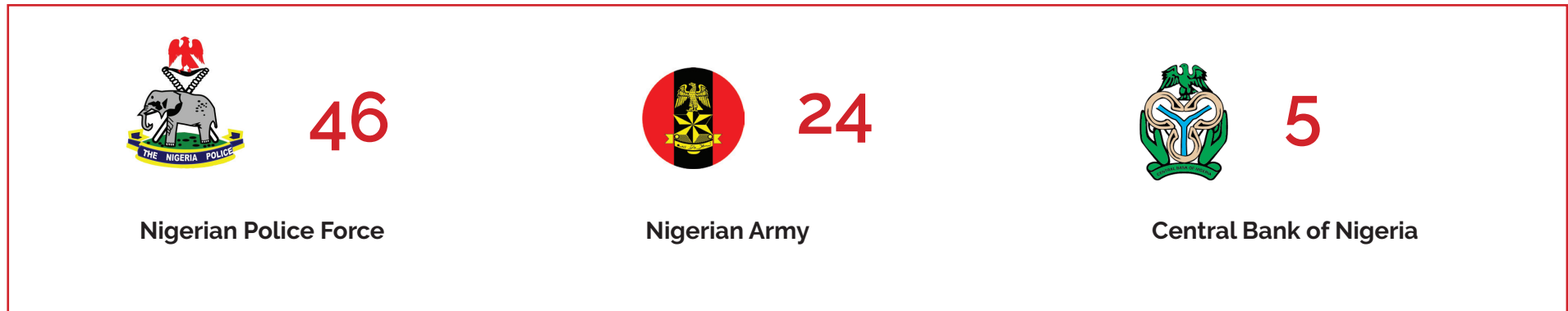

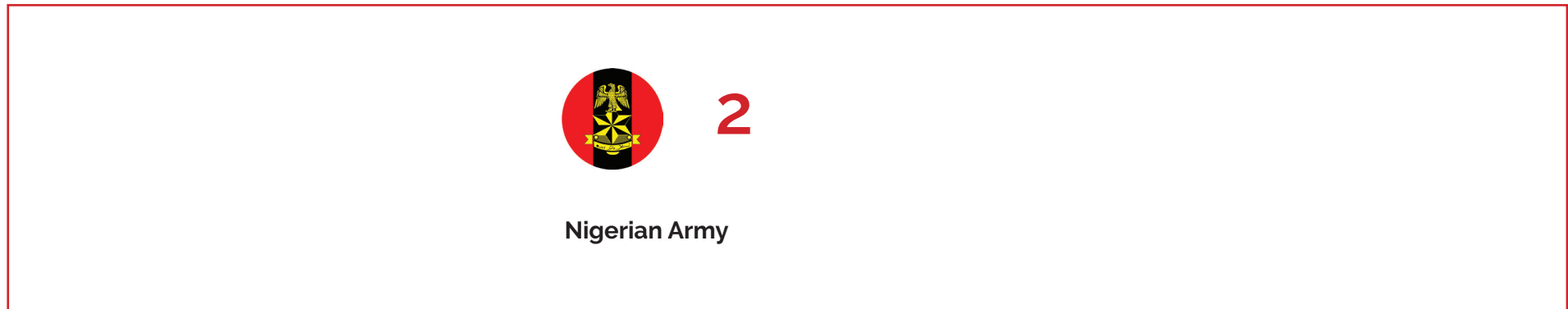
