10. Need to Address the Effect of Rain Disaster in Baruten Local Government Area of Kwara State Motion made and Question proposed:

The House:

Notes that Chikanda is an international border community in Baruten Local Government Area of Kwara State;

Also notes that the community is connected to the Republic of Benin through a bridge to ease the movement of people and transaction of business and services;

Aware that on Monday, 15 August, 2022 there was a torrential rainfall which resulted in a heavy flood thus pulling down the only bridge connecting the Republic of Benin and Nigeria, carting away livestock worth millions of naira, with over seventy (70) farmlands washed away and rendered families homeless in Chikanda community, Baruten Local Government Area of Kwara State;

Cognizant of the need for urgent intervention by relevant agencies of Government to reconstruct the bridge connecting the Republic of Benin and Nigeria to ease the movement of goods and services;

#### Resolves to:

- (i) urge the Federal Ministry of Works and Housing to make provisions for the reconstruction of the bridge connecting the Republic of Benin and Nigeria in the 2023 Budget Estimates;
- (ii) also urge the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) through the Ministry of Humanitarian Affairs, Disaster Management and Social Development, to provide relief materials to the victims;

(iii) mandate the Committees on Emergency and Disaster Preparedness, and Legislative Compliance to ensure compliance and report within eight (8) weeks (Hon. Mohammed Omar Bio Baruten/Kaiama Federal Constituency).

Agreed to.
