8. **Privilege (Order Six, Rule 2)**

Hon. Taiwo Oluga Olufemi (*Ayedaade/Irewole/Isokan Federal Constituency*), drew the attention of the House to a Motion in her name, on Wednesday, 23 November, 2022 on the “*Need to Condemn Attacks on Offices and Facilities of the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC)*”, which was deferred to enable the Committee on Rules and Business clarify if a Motion on the same subject matter was before a Committee of the House. She however, noted that a report has not been presented while attacks on the offices of INEC have continued unabated. She viewed the inability to present her Motion as a breach of her privilege and therefore prayed the House to present a motion on the matter.

*Mr Speaker noted her privilege and directed the Committee on Rules and Business to list the Motion for presentation the next legislative day.*

*Aware of the findings which reveal that the Clauses are not inconsistent with any extant law on Security Agencies in the country;*

*Appreciates the need to recommit Clauses 7, 8, 10, 21 and 22 for reconsideration to achieve the intent of the enactment;*

*Resolves to:*

Rescind its decision on Clauses 7, 8, 10, 21 and 22 of the Bill and commit same to the Committee of the Whole for reconsideration (*Hon. Abubakar Hassan Fulata — Birniwa/Guri/Kiri-Kasamma Federal Constituency*).

*Debate.*

*Ordered: Committee on Rules and Business to represent the Motion and provide Members with the provisions of the affected Clauses.*

**PART I — OBJECTIVE AND APPLICATION**

**PART II — ESTABLISHMENT OF THE NATIONAL SENIOR SECONDARY EDUCATION COMMISSION AND ITS GOVERNING BOARD**

**Committee's Recommendation:**

**Clause 3: Establishment of the National Senior Secondary Education Commission.**

(1) There is established a body known as the National Senior Secondary Education Commission ("the Commission").

(2) The Commission —

(a) shall be a body corporate with perpetual succession and a common seal;

- (b) may sue or be sued in its corporate name; and
- (c) may acquire, hold and dispose of property whether moveable or immoveable (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 3 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

**Committee's Recommendation:**

**Clause 4: Governing Board of the Commission.**

- (1) There is established for the Commission a Governing Board ("the Board").
- (2) The Board shall consist of —
  - (a) a part-time Chairman, who shall be an experienced educationist up to Ph.D. level with twenty (20) years cognate experience;
  - (b) a representative each of the Federal Ministry responsible for education, and finance not below directorate cadre;
  - (c) a representative of each of the six geo-political zones of the Federation on rotational basis for a single term, who shall be an experienced educationist;
  - (d) a person to represent the Federal Capital Territory (FCT), Abuja, who shall be an experienced educationist;
  - (e) a person to represent —
    - (i) the National Education Research and Development Council,
    - (ii) the National Teachers Institute,
    - (iii) the Nigerian Union of Teachers,
    - (iv) the National Association of Proprietors of Private Schools (NAPPS); and Association of Private School Owners of Nigeria on a two years rotational basis as part of (iv),
    - (v) Teachers Registration Council of Nigeria (TRCN),
    - (vi) a representative of relevant examination bodies on a two years rotational basis,
    - (vii) all Nigeria Confederation of Principals of Secondary Schools;
    - (f) two persons appointed on merit to represent public interest; and
    - (g) the Executive Secretary of the Commission, who shall serve as the Secretary to the Board.
- (3) The Chairman and other members of the Board other than *ex-officio* members shall be appointed by the President on the recommendation of the Minister.

- (4) The supplementary provisions contained in the Schedule to this Bill shall have effect with respect to the proceeding of the Board and matters provided in it (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 4 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

**Committee's Recommendation:**

**Clause 5: Tenure of office.**

The Chairman and other members of the Board, other than an *ex-officio* members shall hold office —

- (a) for a term of four years in the first instance and may be re-appointed for a further term of four years and no more; and
- (b) on such terms and conditions as may be specified in the letter of appointment (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 5 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

**Committee's Recommendation:**

**Clause 6: Removal and cessation of membership.**

- (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 5 of this Bill, a member of the Board shall cease to hold office as a member, where the member —
- (a) resigns the appointment by notice in writing addressed to the President;
- (b) is of unsound mind;
- (c) is bankrupt or makes a compromise with his creditors;
- (d) is convicted of a felony or any offence involving dishonesty or corruption;
- (e) is incapable of discharging the functions of the office, whether arising from infirmity of mind, body or any other cause; or
- (f) is guilty of misconduct
- (2) Where the President is satisfied that it is not in the interest of the Commission or the public for a member to continue in office, the President may, in writing remove the member.
- (3) Where a vacancy occurs in the membership of the board it shall be filled by the appointment of a successor to represent the same interest as and for the unexpired term of the office of such member (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 6 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

**Committee's Recommendation:**

**Clause 7: Allowances and Benefits of Board Members.**

The Chairman and members of the Board shall be paid such allowances and benefits as the Federal Government may, from time to time direct (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 7 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

**Committee's Recommendation:**

**Clause 8: Powers of the Board.**

The Board shall have power to —

- (a) approve the policy guidelines for the operation of the senior secondary education programme in Nigeria;
- (b) approve staff regulations and conditions of service;
- (c) approve the structuring of the Commission into such number of departments and Units as appropriate in line with best practices for effective discharge of the functions of the Commission;
- (d) ensure strict adherence to the functions and mandates of departments and units as contained in the extra-ministerial rules and regulations guiding the conduct of the Commission
- (e) perform any other function assigned to the Board under this Bill (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 8 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

**PART III — FUNCTIONS AND POWERS OF THE COMMISSION**

**Committee's Recommendation:**

**Clause 9: Functions of the Commission.**

The Commission shall —

- (a) prescribe and enforce the national minimum standards for senior secondary education in Nigeria in line with the National Policy on Education and directive of the National Council on Education and ensure effective monitoring of the standards;
- (b) formulate policy guidelines for the operation of the Senior Secondary Education Programme in the Federation subject to the approval of the Board;
- (c) receive block grant of One percent of consolidated revenue fund from the Federal Government and allocate to Federal Unity Colleges (FUCs), 36 States Governments and Federal Capital Territory and other relevant agencies implementing the Senior Secondary Education in accordance with an approved formula as may be laid down by the Board of the Commission and approved by the Federal Executive Council, provided that the Commission shall not disburse such grant until it is satisfied that the earlier disbursements have been applied in accordance with the provision of this Bill.
- (d) implement the senior secondary education programme in Nigeria;
- (e) present periodic progress reports, subject to the approval of the Board, on the implementation of senior secondary education programme to the President through the Minister;
- (g) identify priority projects in the Federal Unity Colleges (FUCs) and provide intervention that will address infrastructural deficits in their senior



secondary schools;

- (h) receives 40% counterpart funding from the 36 States and Federal Capital Territory as condition for the assessment of NSSEC grants for the development of Senior Secondary Education in their respective States and FCT;
- (i) develop and disseminate curricula and instructional materials for senior secondary education in Nigeria in collaboration with other relevant agencies;
- (j) establish senior secondary education data bank and conduct research on senior secondary education in Nigeria;
- (k) collaborate with the Nigeria Educational Research and Development Council (NERDC), to ensure effective research, development, implementation and monitor of curriculum for senior secondary education;
- (l) regulate the implementation of the safe school initiatives in senior secondary schools in Nigeria;
- (m) collaborate with relevant agencies and organizations to promote science, technology, engineering, arts and design, and mathematics (STEAM), technical, vocational education and training (TVET) and entrepreneurial skills at senior secondary education level;
- (n) collaborate with relevant examination bodies to monitor the conduct of external examinations at the senior secondary education level;
- (o) collaborate with other relevant agencies and stakeholders to promote inclusive senior secondary education programmes in accordance with the provisions of this Bill;
- (p) collaborate with state governments to coordinate personnel audit of teaching and non-teaching staff of all senior secondary educational institutions in Nigeria from time to time;
- (q) collaborate with donor agencies and other development partners on matters relating to senior secondary education; and
- (r) carry out such functions as the Minister may, from time to time, determine as are necessary or expedient to ensure the efficient performance of the functions of the Commission under this Bill (*Hon. Julius Ihonybere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 9 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

**PART IV — APPOINTMENT OF THE EXECUTIVE  
SECRETARY AND STAFF OF THE COMMISSION**

**Committee's Recommendation:**

**Clause 10: Appointment of the Executive Secretary.**

- (1) There shall be for the Commission, an Executive Secretary, who shall be —
  - (a) appointed by the President on the recommendation of the Minister;
  - (b) the Chief Executive Officer and Accounting Officer of the Commission; and

- (c) responsible for the execution of the policy and the day-to-day running of the affairs of the Commission;
- (2) A person shall not be qualified to be appointed as the Executive Secretary of the Commission unless the person possesses an academic qualification up to Ph.D. level in education and cognate experience of not less than twenty years.
- (3) The Executive Secretary shall hold office —
- (a) for a term of four years in the first instance and may be re-appointed for a further term of four years and no more; and
- (b) on such terms and conditions as may be specified in the letter of appointment;
- (4) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (3) of this section, the Executive Secretary may —
- (a) resign the appointment by notice in writing addressed to the President through the Board; or
- (b) be removed by the President for —
- (i) inability to discharge the functions of the office, whether arising from infirmity of mind, body or any other cause, or
- (ii) misconduct.
- (5) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (4) of this section, the Executive Secretary may be removed by the President, where the President is satisfied that it is not in the interest of the Commission or the public for the Executive Secretary to remain in office (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 10 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

**Committee's Recommendation:**

**Clause 11: Staff of the Commission.**

- (1) The Commission may, subject to the approval of the Board, appoint staff as it deems necessary for the Commission —
- (a) for the performance of its functions under this Bill; and
- (b) on terms and conditions with allowances and benefits as may be determined by the Board in consultation with the National Salaries Incomes and Wages Commission.
- (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1) of this section, staff of the Commission may be appointed by the Commission by way of transfer, secondment, deployment or posting from the public service of the Federation (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 11 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

**Committee's Recommendation:****Clause 12: Service in the Commission.**

- (1) Service in the Commission shall be approved service for the purpose of the Pension Reform Act and staff of the Commission shall be entitled to pensions, gratuities and other retirement benefits prescribed under the Pension Reform Act.
- (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1) of this section, nothing in this Bill shall prevent the appointment of a person to any office on terms, which preclude the grant of pension, gratuity or other retirement benefit in respect of that office.
- (3) For the purpose of the application of the provisions of the Pension Reform Act, any power exercisable by a Minister or other authority of the Federal Government, other than the power to make regulations under the Pension Reforms Act is vested in and shall be exercisable by the Board and not by any other person or authority (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 12 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

**Committee's Recommendation:****Clause 13: Staff Regulations and discipline.**

- (1) Subject to the provisions of this Bill, the Commission may make staff regulations relating generally to the conditions of service of the staff, and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, such regulations may provide for —
  - (a) the appointment, promotion and disciplinary control of staff of the Commission; and
  - (b) appeal procedure for staff against dismissal or other disciplinary measures and until such regulations are made any instrument relating to conditions of service in the Public Service of the Federation shall be applicable, with such modifications as may be necessary, to the staff of the Commission.
- (2) The staff regulations made under subsection (1) of this section shall not have effect until approved by the Board, and where approved the Commission shall cause a notice of the staff regulations to be issued to all affected staff in such manner as it may, from time to time, determine (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 13 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

#### PART V — FINANCIAL PROVISIONS OF THE COMMISSION

**Committee's Recommendation:****Clause 14: Account of the Commission.**

- (1) The Commission shall maintain an account ("the Account") into which shall be credited and be defrayed all the expenditure incurred by the Commission.
- (2) There shall be paid into the Account maintained in subsection (1) of this Bill —
  - (a) such budgetary allocations from the Federal Government for running expenses of the Commission; and

- (b) all other assets accruing, from time to time, to the Commission other than payment made pursuant to section 21 of this Bill (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 14 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

***Committee's Recommendation:***

**Clause 15: Expenditure of the Commission.**

The Commission may, from time to time; apply the proceeds of the Fund established under section 15 (1) of this Bill —

- (a) to the cost of administration of the Commission;
- (b) to a limit as to what Commission will expend in line with financial regulations;
- (c) to reimburse members of the Board or any committee set up by the Board, for such expenses as may be expressly authorized by the Board;
- (d) to the payment of salaries, allowances, pensions, and other retirement benefits payable to the staff of the Commission, provided that no payment of any kind except as may be expressly authorized by the Board, shall be made to a person who is in receipt of emoluments from the Federal or State Government;
- (e) for the maintenance of property vested in the Commission; and
- (f) for other expenditure in connection with the functions of the Commission under this Bill (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 15 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

***Committee's Recommendation:***

**Clause 16: Annual estimates and accounts.**

- (1) The Commission shall, not later than 31st October in each year, submit to the Minister an estimate of its expenditure and income, including payments to the Fund, for the preceding year.
- (2) The Commission shall keep proper accounts in respect of each financial year and proper records of every account and shall cause such accounts to be audited within six months after the end of each financial year by auditors appointed from the list of auditors and in accordance with the guidelines by the Auditor-General for the Federation (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 16 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

***Committee's Recommendation:***

**Clause 17: Annual reports.**

The Commission shall prepare and submit to the President through the Minister, not later than six months after the end of each financial year, a report on the activities of the Commission during the preceding year and shall include in the report, a copy of the audited accounts of the Commission for that year and the auditor's report on the accounts (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 17 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

**Committee's Recommendation:**

**Clause 18: Power to accept gifts.**

- (1) The Commission may accept gifts of land, money or other property on such terms and conditions, if any, as may be specified by the person or organization making the gift.
- (2) The Commission shall not accept any gift, where the conditions attached by the person or organization making the gift are inconsistent with the functions of the Commission under this Bill, any other law, or the code of conduct for public officers (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 18 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

**Committee's Recommendation:**

**Clause 19: Power to borrow.**

The Commission may, with the approval of the Board, borrow by way of loan, overdraft or otherwise from any source, such sums as it may require for the performance of its functions and meeting its obligations under this Bill (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 19 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

**PART VI — OBJECTIVES, ESTABLISHMENT AND DISBURSEMENT OF  
THE NATIONAL SENIOR SECONDARY EDUCATION COMMISSION FUND**

**Committee's Recommendation:**

**Clause 20: Objectives of the National Senior Secondary Education Commission Fund.**

The objectives of the National Senior Secondary Education Commission Fund are —

- (a) provide grants to the Federal Unity Colleges, 36 States governments and Federal Capital Territory (FCT) for the provision of physical infrastructure for teaching and learning, instructional materials and laboratory equipment
- (b) to enhance science, technology, engineering, arts and design, and mathematics (STEAM), technical, vocational education, and training (TVET), entrepreneurial skills; teachers development, instructional materials, educational imbalance, physical and mentally challenged;
- (c) to provide support services for the training, re-training and development of academic and non-academic Staff;
- (d) any other need as may be approved by the Board for the improvement and maintenance of quality standard in senior secondary education in Nigeria (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 20 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

**Committee's Recommendation:**

**Clause 21: Establishment of the National Senior Secondary Education Commission Fund.**

There is established a National Senior Secondary Education Commission Fund ("the NSSEC Fund") into which shall be paid —

- (a) Federal Government allocation of not less than one percent of the Consolidated Revenue Fund;

- (b) take off grants from the Federal Government for the Commission;
- (c) money received by the Commission from endowments and fund-raising activities relating to senior secondary education; and
- (d) money received as foreign aid, local and international donor grants for senior secondary education in Nigeria (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 21 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

**Committee's Recommendation:**

**Clause 22: Disbursement of the NSSEC Fund.**

- (1) The Commission shall disburse the money in the NSSEC Fund established under section 22 of this Bill for the development of senior secondary education in Nigeria.
- (2) Twenty (20) percent of One percent of CRF of NSSEC Fund shall be disbursed to senior secondary arms of the Federal Unity Colleges (FUCs) as intervention based on their priority projects. While the remaining 80% will be shared as follows:
  - (a) 50% of the fund will be shared equally as grants to 36 States and FCT Senior Secondary Education Board to enhance rapid infrastructural development of senior secondary education across the country;
  - (b) 2% to be allocated to NSSEC as Monitoring and evaluation Fund;
  - (c) 2% to be allocated as NSSEC Implementation Fund to cater for personnel, overhead and capital of the Commission;
  - (d) the State Government shall pay a counterpart funding of forty (40) percent of the amount accruing to it on yearly basis into the Commission account as a condition for the assessment of NSSEC grants;
  - (e) other programmes shall be allocated accordingly based on these percentages :
    - (i) Technical, Vocational Education and Training (TVET) -7%
    - (ii) Teachers Development - 8%
    - (iii) Instructional Materials - 5%
    - (iv) Educational Imbalance - 3%
    - (v) Physically and Mentally Challenged -2%.
- (3) The Commission shall, before the disbursement of the money in the NSSEC Fund, set aside in each year 2 per cent of the total monies accruing to the NSSEC Fund in the preceding year, which shall be applied to —
  - (a) monitor and evaluate Federal Government's interventions under this Bill, and

- (b) such other activities incidental to the objectives of the NSSEC Fund.
- (4) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (2) of this Bill, the Commission shall have power to sanction any Senior Secondary Education Board that applied previous disbursement of the NSSEC Fund for other purposes outside the provisions of this Bill (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 22 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

PART VII — ESTABLISHMENT, COMPOSITION AND FUNCTIONS  
OF THE STATE SENIOR SECONDARY EDUCATION BOARD

*Committee's Recommendation:*

**Clause 23: Establishment and composition of the State Senior Education Board.**

- (1) For the purposes of implementation of the provisions of this Bill, each state of the Federation and the Federal Capital Territory, shall establish a Senior Secondary Education Board, ('the Education Board'), which shall consist of —
- (a) a full-time Chairman who shall consist of —
- (i) an experienced educationist or administrator up to PhD. level and twenty (20) years' cognate experience; with proven integrity; and
- (ii) the Chief Executive and accounting officer responsible for the day to day activities of the Education Board;
- (b) a representative of the Ministry responsible for education and Finance in the FCT or the State, not below directorate cadre;
- (c) representative of All Nigeria Confederation of Principals of Secondary Schools in the FCT or the State;
- (d) a representative of the Commission, not below directorate cadre;
- (e) three members appointed from different Area Councils in the FCT or from the three Senatorial districts in the State in rotational basis for two years; and
- (f) the Secretary to the Education Board of the FCT or State.
- (3) The Chairman, members and Secretary of the Education Board who are not *ex-officio* members shall be appointed by the Minister of FCT or the Governor on a full time basis;
- (4) Member of the Education Board, except Area Councils or Senatorial representatives shall hold office :
- (a) for a term of four years in the first instance and may be re-appointed for a further term of four years and no more; and
- (b) on such terms and conditions as may be specified in the letters to appointment (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 23 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

**Committee's Recommendation:**

**Clause 24: Establishment of a separate account by the Education Board.**

- (1) An Education Board shall establish and maintain a separate account into which shall be paid and credited money from the Federal or State Governments or any other source.
- (2) There shall be disbursed from the account all expenses relating to the management of senior secondary education in the State (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 24 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

**Committee's Recommendation:**

**Clause 25: Functions and Powers of the State and FCT Senior Secondary Education Boards.**

The State and FCT Senior Secondary Education Board shall be responsible for —

- (a) the management of Senior secondary school in the state and FCT;
- (b) the recruitment, appointment, promotion and discipline of teaching and non-teaching staff on grade level 07 and above;
- (c) posting and deployment of staff, including intra state transfer;
- (d) disbursing funds accruing to it from both Federal and State Government sources;
- (e) setting up an effective functional monitoring and supervisory units in collaboration with Commission;
- (f) undertaking new capital projects;
- (g) the training and re-training of teaching and non-teaching staff;
- (h) assessing and funding of salaries and allowances of teaching and non-teaching staff based on the scheme of service approved by the State Government;
- (i) ensuring that annual reports are rendered by Heads of Schools on teachers appointed to assist them;
- (j) preparing testimonials and certificates of service for teaching and non-teaching staff whenever necessary;
- (k) dealing with leave matters, including annual vacation;
- (l) submission of an annual action plan of projects to be undertaking to the Commission; and
- (m) carry out such other functions as the Commission, may, from time to time, assign to it (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 25 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*



## PART VIII — MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

**Committee's Recommendation:****Clause 26: Power to obtain Information.**

- (1) For the purpose of carrying out the functions conferred on the Commission under this Bill, the Executive Secretary or any other officer of the Commission authorized in that behalf —
  - (a) shall have right of access to all the records of any institution or authority to which this Bill applies; and
  - (b) may, by notice in writing served on any person in charge of any institution or authority, require that person or authority to furnish information on such matters as may be specified in the notice.
- (3) A person or authority required to furnish information pursuant to subsection (1) of this section shall comply within 7 days of receipt of the notice (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 26 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

**Committee's Recommendation:****Clause 27: Regulations.**

The Commission may, with the approval of the Board make regulations as are necessary for giving full effect to the provisions of this Bill (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 27 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

**Committee's Recommendation:****Clause 28: Directives by the Minister.**

The Minister may give the Commission directives of a general nature or relating generally to matters of policy with regards to the exercise by the Commission of its functions, and it shall be the duty of the Commission to comply with such directives (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 28 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

**Committee's Recommendation:****Clause 29: Repeal.**

The National Secondary Education Commission Act, CAP N73, LFN 2004 is repealed (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 29 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

**Committee's Recommendation:****Clause 30: Savings and transitional provision.**

- (1) The power, duties, and functions of the National Secondary Education Commission established under the National Secondary Education Commission Act CAP N73, LFN 2004 ("the repealed Act") are transferred to the Commission under this Bill.
- (2) Anything made, done or having effect under the repealed Act and having any resulting or continuing effect shall be treated as from the commencement of this Bill, as if it were made or done by the Commission established under this Bill.

- (3) A person who before the commencement of this Bill, was deployed, appointed or employed by the Commission established under the repealed Act shall continue in office and be deemed to have been deployed, appointed or employed by the Commission established under this Bill.
- (4) All assets, rights, liabilities and obligations of the Commission under the repealed Act shall, by virtue of this Bill, be deemed to be that of the Commission established under this Bill (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that Clause 30 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

**Committee's Recommendation:**

**Clause 31: Interpretation.**

In this Bill —

"Account" means the account of the Commission established under section 15 of this Bill (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that the meaning of the word "Account" be as defined in the interpretation to this Bill — Agreed to.*

"Authority" means the State Senior Secondary Education Board or its equivalent in the Federal Capital Territory and the Local Government (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that the meaning of the word "Authority" be as defined in the interpretation to this Bill — Agreed to.*

"Board" means the Board established for the Commission under section 4 of this Bill (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that the meaning of the word "Board" be as defined in the interpretation to this Bill — Agreed to.*

"Commission" means the National Senior Secondary Education Commission established under section 3 of this Bill (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

"Counterpart Funding" means the amount paid by the state governments as condition for the assessment of grant from the Commission established under section 21 of this Bill (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that the meaning of the words "Counterpart Funding" be as defined in the interpretation to this Bill — Agreed to.*

"Education Board" means the State Senior Secondary Education Board established under section 24 of this Bill (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that the meaning of the words "Education Board" be as defined in the interpretation to this Bill — Agreed to.*

"Educational Imbalance" means unequal distribution of academic resources, including but not limited to; school funding, qualified and experienced teachers, books, and technologies to socially excluded communities (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that the meaning of the words "Educational Imbalance" be as defined in the interpretation to this Bill — Agreed to.*

"Ex-officio" to means a non-voting member who holds public office from a recognized Association or Ministry, Department and Agency (MDA) (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that the meaning of the words "Ex-officio" be as defined in the interpretation to this Bill — Agreed to.*

"Federal Government" means the Federal Government of Nigeria (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that the meaning of the words "Federal Government" be as defined in the interpretation to this Bill — Agreed to.*

"Institution" means a senior secondary school or any other institution in Nigeria recognized as such by the Commission, the Education Board or any other authority which benefits from the National Fund (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that the meaning of the word "Institution" be as defined in the interpretation to this Bill — Agreed to.*

"Instructional Materials" are the content or information conveyed within a course. These include the lectures, readings, textbooks, multimedia components, and other resources in a course (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that the meaning of the words "Instructional Materials" be as defined in the interpretation to this Bill — Agreed to.*

"Member" means a member of the Board established under section 4 of this Bill (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that the meaning of the word "Member" be as defined in the interpretation to this Bill — Agreed to.*

"Minister" means the Minister charged with responsibility for matters relating to education (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that the meaning of the word "Minister" be as defined in the interpretation to this Bill — Agreed to.*

"NSSEC Fund" means the National Senior Secondary Education Commission Fund established under section 21 of this Bill (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that the meaning of the words "NSSEC Fund" be as defined in the interpretation to this Bill — Agreed to.*

"NSSEC Implementation Fund" means fund that covers the personnel, overhead and capital of the Commission (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that the meaning of the words "NSSEC Implementation Fund" be as defined in the interpretation to this Bill — Agreed to.*

"Physically and Mentally challenged" means a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more of an individual's major life activities (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that the meaning of the words "Physically and Mentally challenged" be as defined in the interpretation to this Bill — Agreed to.*

"Technical, Vocational Education and Training" refers to all forms and levels of education and training which provide knowledge and skills related to occupations in various sectors of economic and social life through formal, non-formal and informal learning methods in both school-based and work-based learning (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that the meaning of the words "Technical, Vocational Educational and Training" be as defined in the interpretation to this Bill — Agreed to.*

*Question that Clause 31 stands part of the Bill — Agreed to.*

**Committee's Recommendation:**

**Clause 32: Short Title.**

This Bill may be cited as the National Senior Secondary Education Commission Bill, 2022 (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

## SCHEDULE

[Section 2(3)]

### SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE BOARD, ETC.

#### *Proceedings of the Governing Board*

1. (1) Subject to this Bill and to section 27 of the Interpretation Act, the Board may make standing orders regulating the proceeding of the Board or a committee.
- (2) The quorum at a meeting of the Board shall be not less than one-third of the total number of the Board members present at the meeting.

#### *Meeting*

2. (1) The Board shall meet not more than four times in each year.
- (2) At any meeting of the Board, the Chairman shall preside but in his absence, the members present at the meeting shall appoint one of their number to preside at the meeting.
- (3) Where the Board desires to obtain the advice of any person on a particular matter, the Board may co-opt him for such period as it thinks fit, but a person co-opted by

virtue of this sub-paragraph shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Board and shall not count towards a quorum.

- (4) Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this paragraph, the first meeting of the Board shall be summoned by the Minister.

#### *Committees*

3. (1) The Board may appoint one or more committees to carry out on behalf of the Board such functions as the Board may determine.
- (2) A committee appointed under this paragraph shall consist of such number of persons, not necessarily all members of the Board, as may be determined by the Board and a person other than a member of the Board shall hold office on the committee in accordance with the terms of his appointment.
- (3) A decision of a committee of the Board shall be of no effect until it is confirmed by the Board.

#### *Miscellaneous*

4. (1) The fixing of the seal of the Board shall be authenticated by the signature of the Chairman or any other member authorized generally or specially to act for that purpose by the Board.
- (2) Any contract or instrument which, if made or executed by a person not being a body corporate, may not be required to be under seal may be made or executed on behalf of the Board by the Executive Secretary or any person generally or specially authorized to act for that purpose by the Board.
5. The validity of any proceedings of the Board or a committee shall not be affected by —
- (a) any vacancy in the membership of the Board or a committee; or
- (b) reason that a person not entitled to do so took part in the proceedings of the Board or a committee.
6. A member of the governing board or a committee who has a personal interest in any contract or arrangement entered into or proposed to be considered by the Board or a committee shall disclose his interest to the Board or committee and shall not vote on any question relating to the contract or arrangement (*Hon. Julius Ihonvbere — Owan East/West Federal Constituency*).

*Question that the provisions of the Schedule stand part of the Bill — Agreed to.*
