RESCISSION AND RE-COMMITTAL OF THE 2024 APPROPRIATION ACT (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2024

1. Rescission and Re-committal of the 2024 Appropriation Act (Amendment) Bill, to the Committee of Supply.

Sponsor: Sen. Bamidele, Michael Opeyemi (Ekiti Central-Senate Leader)

The Senate:

Recalls that the 2024 Appropriation Act (Amendment) Bill, 2024 was passed by the Senate and the House of Representatives and was forwarded to the Clerk to the National Assembly for onward transmission to the President, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces of the Federal Republic of Nigeria for Assent;

Informed that after critical examination of the Bill, the Directorate of Legal Services of the National Assembly observed some fundamental issues which require fresh legislative action on the following Sections:- i.e.

- 1. Long Title;
- 2. Clause 1;
- 3. Clause 13;
- 4. Clause 14; and
- 5. Explanatory Memorandum;

Aware that a Technical Committee of the Senate, the House of Representatives and the Directorate of Legal Services met and worked on the Bill; and

Relying on order 1(b) of the Senate Standing Orders,

Accordingly resolves to:

Rescind its decision on the Bill as passed and re-commit same to the Committee of Supply for re-consideration and passage.

CONSIDERATION OF A BILL

1. A Bill for an Act to Amend the Central Bank of Nigeria Act, Cap. C4, Laws of the Federation of Nigeria, 2004 to increase the total Advances of the Central Bank of Nigeria to the Federal Government from Five percent to a maximum of Fifteen percent and for other Matters Connected Thereto, 2024 (SB. 552) - Second Reading
