MOTION

1. Need for Special Intervention by the Senate to urge the Federal Ministry of Works to expedite action and complete the rehabilitation of the Umuahia-Ikot Ekpene Federal Road to relieve the suffering of Nigerian Motorists and address insecurity in the area.

Sponsored: Sen. Akobundu, Austin (Abia Central).

The Senate:

Notes that the Umuahia-Ikot Ekpene Road, a major link between Abia State and Akwa Ibom State through Ikwuano Local Government Area (LGA), has been in a deplorable state of disrepair for over 30 years;

Also notes that despite efforts by successive governments at both the federal and state levels to provide remedial interventions, the road has remained in poor condition for reasons that appear inexplicable;

Observes that following years of public outcry from the people of Abia and Akwa Ibom states, the Federal Government awarded the contract for the total reconstruction/rehabilitation of the road in 2018 to Messrs Hartland Nigeria Limited and Raydon & Company Nigeria Limited, valued at approximately N13 billion. Subsequently, funding for this project was transferred to the NNPC under the tax credit initiative;

Aware that Messrs Hartland Nigeria Limited and Raydon & Company Nigeria Limited have since commenced work on the first phase of the project. However, the pace of work has been extremely slow. Many dilapidated sections of the road have further deteriorated due to the rainy season, rendering them impassable and creating significant hardship for motorists and traders commuting between Abia and Akwa Ibom States. Residents of Ikwuano LGA in Abia Central Senatorial District have also been left in despair.

Also aware that the issue of the slow pace of work on this road was raised during debates on the 2024 Appropriation Bill last year, yet no significant progress has been made;

Conscious of the economic consequences of the delay in completing this project on the people of Abia and Akwa Ibom States, who rely on this road daily for commuting, trade, and other activities; and

Worried that unless urgent measures are taken by the Federal Government to repair the failed sections of the road during this dry season, the road will be completely cut off during the next rainy season. This would exacerbate the suffering of the people and motorists who depend on this vital link between Umuahia in Abia State and Ikot Ekpene in Akwa Ibom State. It would also further hinder transporters traveling this route daily from Cross River, Akwa Ibom, Abia, Onitsha, and Lagos,

Accordingly resolves to:

- i. *Urge* the Federal Ministry of Works to immediately release funds for the completion of the Umuahia-Ikot Ekpene Road during the current dry season; and
- ii. *Mandate* the Committee on Works to urgently investigate and unravel the causes of delays, and determine the extent of failure and report back to the Senate within two weeks for further legislative action.
