## **MOTION**

1. Demise of Senator Joseph Iorshagher Akaagerger (1956-2025)

Sponsor: Sen. Emmanuel, Udende Memga (Benue North-East)

The Senate:

*Notes* with deep sorrow the death of Senator Joseph Iorshagher Akaagerger, a distinguished Nigerian statesman, military officer, legal luminary, and former Senator of the Federal Republic, who passed away on 19th May 2025, at the age of 69;

Also notes that Senator Akaagerger was born on 5th May 1956 in Iber-Gaar, Konshisha Local Government Area of Benue State, and led an exemplary life of national service that spanned the military, legal, political, and traditional sectors of society;

Aware that Senator Akaagerger began his military training at the Nigerian Defence Academy (NDA), Kaduna in 1976 and later proceeded to the world-renowned Royal Military Academy, Sandhurst, United Kingdom (1977–1979), where he graduated as a commissioned officer of the Nigerian Army;

Also aware that he served in various sensitive and strategic positions, including:

- Adjutant of the 3 Provost Battalion, Jos (1983–1985);
- Officer Commanding D Company, 231 Battalion, Maiduguri (1986–1987);
- Commanding Officer, 195 Battalion, Ojo Cantonment, Lagos (1990-1991);
- Directing Staff and Deputy Chief Instructor, Armed Forces Command and Staff College, Jaji (1991–1994), where he mentored and evaluated Mid-career Military Officers in operational command and ethics;
- Served at various times in Army Headquarters and was highly regarded for professionalism and loyalty;

Recalls that in August 1998, during Nigeria's delicate democratic transition, he was appointed Military Administrator of Katsina State, where he governed effectively until May 1999 and was instrumental in creating a peaceful political environment that supported the election and transition from the military to civilian rule;

*Notes* that after his retirement from military service, Senator Akaagerger transitioned to a successful legal career. He held a Bachelor of Laws (LLB) and Master of Laws (LLM) from the University of Jos, and a Ph.D. in International Economic Law from Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria. He was called to the Nigerian Bar in 1987;

Also notes that he established a reputable law firm, J.I. Akaagerger & Co. (Ambe Chambers), through which he provided legal services to individuals, institutions, and the community;

*Remembers* that in 2007, Senator Akaagerger was elected on the platform of the People's Democratic Party (PDP) to represent Benue North East Senatorial District in the 6th Senate of the National Assembly (2007–2011);

**Observes** that during his tenure in the Senate:

- He served with distinction on several committees and was known for his deep legal insights and advocacy for rule of law and constitutional development;
- He was a vocal contributor to debates on national security, justice reform, military welfare, and good governance;
- He served as Publicity Secretary of the Northern Senators Forum, helping to coordinate positions and enhance regional collaboration;

Further notes that he was a traditional titleholder, bearing the revered Tiv title of "Ambe u Konshisha", and was a trustee of the Jichira Development Association, playing a significant role in community development and peace building across Benue State;

Recognizes that Senator Akaagerger's legacy is that of a principled patriot, who served Nigeria loyally in peace and in conflict, in uniform and in parliament, and whose life symbolized discipline, humility, and service above self; and

Also recognizes that he is survived by his beloved wife, Chief (Mrs.) Joyce Mbafan Akaagerger, and their children, and leaves behind a grateful constituency and a nation that benefitted from his labours,

Accordingly resolves to:

- i. Observe a minute of silence in honour of the late Senator Joseph Iorshagher Akaagerger; and
- ii. *Send* a high-powered Senate delegation to pay a condolence visit to his family and the Government and people of Benue State, especially Benue North East Senatorial District;
