#### **MOTION**

1. Commendation of Troops of Operation *Hadin Kai* of the Nigerian Armed Forces in the fight against terrorist attacks in Buratai and Mallam Fatori Local Government Area of Borno State.

Sponsor: Sen. Monguno, Mohammed Tahir (Borno North)

The Senate:

*Notes* that the Troops of operation *Hadin Kai* of the Nigerian Military had successfully foiled attacks on Buratai, Biu Local Government and Mallam Fatori, and Abadam Local Government Areas, last week;

Also notes that in the course of the operation, the leader of the terrorist group, Aminu Abu Fatima was killed by the Troops of operation *Hadin Kai*, a development, which gladded the hearts of the inhabitants of the affected areas;

Further notes that prior to the successful operation carried out by of this courageous and gallant Troops, the following 29 villages were under siege of the terrorist group, led by its slain leader. The villages are: Kangarwa, Waregellam, Kuski, Buluma, Chungo zamno, Alairu, kawulam, Sasa bulla, Modusuri, Damshe, Juwularmi, Ngurta lawanti, Ngurta goniri, Dumbullam, Niyamaram, Kosomiri, Kiliyari, Kodori, Mallum gubtori, Galjam, Goma, Yeyawu, Alai bashirti, Masallaram, Basher, Kalla, Lujiya, Fuwalili, Dawuro and Doron;

Recalls that in the foiled attacks, the coordinated efforts by the ground force and Air component of the operation Hadin Kai, led to scores of the terrorists being neutralized with their assorted arms, weapons and ammunitions recovered from them. Also, the lifeless bodies of the terrorists were recovered alongside large cache of assorted arms and ammunitions;

Aware that the Troops at Mallam Fatori also foiled another attack by the insurgents who attempted to attack the Troops location from different front, as they were intensely engaged with superior fire power and support from ACC Air platforms, causing them to flee in disarray;

Also aware that the relentless and resilient Troops pursued the retreating insurgents after hours of gun dual, neutralizing scores of them while others fled amidst varied degrees of gunshot wounds;

Further aware that several terrorists were killed with many Ak-47 rifles, general purpose machine guns, rocket propelled Gun and other terrorists' equipment recovered;

*Notes* that there is ongoing military surveillance and monitoring of the area by the determined Troops with Air component, providing Air support;

Acknowledges the coordinated efforts and the Air component of the Nigeria Armed forces in this operation, which underscored the determination of the government of *President Bola Ahmad Tinubu*, GCFR to deny and frustrate the terrorists from carryout their nefarious activities; and

Also acknowledges that the recent exploits and success recorded by the Troops of operation *Hadin Kai* of the Nigerian Military has restored the hope and confidence of the people of the area that the military is capable of eliminating terrorism from the country,

Accordingly resolves to:

- *i.* Commend the Nigerian Armed Forces, especially the Troops of operation Hadin Kai for their patriotism and bravery in foiling the attempt attacks by the terrorists; and
- *ii.* Commiserate with the Nigerian Military and the families of the brave officers who lost their lives in the line of duty to their father land.
