The House:

Rescind its decision on the Chartered Institute of Training and Development of Nigeria (Establishment) Bill, 2026 and the Federal Road Safety Commission Act (Amendment) Bill, 2026, and recommit the same to the Committee of the Whole for reconsideration and subsequent passage.
