3. **Reconsideration of Outstanding Bills from Preceding Assembly Pursuant to Order Twelve, Rule 17 (a), (b), (c) & (d) of the House of Representatives:**

Nigerian Film Commission Bill, 2026 (HB. 2522).

Hon Francis Ejiroghene Waive.

The House:

Notes that pursuant to Order Twelve, Rule 17 (a), (b), (c) & (d) of the Standing Orders, the House may, upon being re-gazetted or circulated, reconsider in the Committee of the Whole, without commencing de-novo, the Bills–

- (a) whose report were presented by the Committee before consideration;
- (b) passed by the House and forwarded to the Senate for concurrence for which no concurrence was made or negative;
- (c) passed by the Senate and forwarded to the House for which no concurrence was made or negative; or;
- (d) passed by the preceding Assembly and forwarded to the President for assent but for which assent or withholding thereof were not communicated before the end of the tenure of the preceding Assembly.

Also notes that the Nigerian Film Commission Bill, 2026 was passed by the preceding Assembly and forwarded to the President for assent but for which assent or withholding thereof was not communicated before the end of the tenure of the last Assembly;

Aware that the Bill was read for the first time as HB. 2522;

Resolves to:

Re-commit the Bill to the Committee of the Whole for consideration.
