MOTION

The Growing Menace of Indiscipline in Nigerian Society

Sponsor: Sen. Dachung, Pam Mwadkon (*Plateau North*).

The Senate:

Notes that discipline is a fundamental requirement for national development, social cohesion, public order, and respect for the rule of law;

Also notes that there has been a growing manifestation of indiscipline across various sectors of Nigerian society, including traffic violations, public disorder, vandalism, disregard for lawful authority, workplace misconduct, political intolerance, protocol breaches at public functions, and the reckless use of social media platforms;

Further notes that such acts of indiscipline have contributed to increased insecurity, erosion of societal values, weakening of institutions, and declining public confidence in governance;

Aware that reports from communities, civil society organizations, educational institutions, and the media indicate a disturbing rise in anti-social behaviour, youth involvement in violence, abuse of public facilities, and disregard for established rules and regulations;

Also aware that the causes of indiscipline are multifaceted and include inadequate civic education, poor parenting, youth unemployment, poverty, peer pressure, weak enforcement of laws, abuse of authority, and the culture of impunity;

Further aware that the erosion of moral values and the weakening of traditional and social institutions have further contributed to the decline in responsible citizenship and respect for constituted authority;

Concerned that the continued rise in indiscipline threatens national security, economic growth, educational advancement, social stability, and democratic governance;

Also concerned that the growing culture of lawlessness and disregard for societal norms is undermining efforts to build a peaceful, productive, and prosperous nation;

Further concerned that failure to urgently address this trend may result in further social disintegration, increased criminality, political unrest, and weakening of national values;

Observes that effective civic education, value re-orientation, youth empowerment, parental guidance, responsible leadership, and consistent law enforcement remain critical tools for addressing indiscipline;

Also observes that government institutions, educational establishments, traditional and religious leaders, civil society organizations, the media, families, and citizens all have important roles to play in restoring discipline and civic responsibility in society; and

Reiterates that sustainable national development can only thrive in an environment where citizens observe civic responsibilities and institutions enforce laws fairly and consistently.

Accordingly resolves to:

- i. *Express* deep concern over the increasing level of indiscipline in Nigerian society and call on all stakeholders to take urgent measures to restore discipline, respect for the rule of law, and civic responsibility;
- ii. *Urge* the Federal Government, through the relevant Ministries, Departments and Agencies, to develop and implement a comprehensive National Re-Orientation and Civic Responsibility Programme aimed at promoting discipline, patriotism, integrity, and responsible citizenship;
- iii. *Also urge* the Federal Government to strengthen youth development, skills acquisition, employment generation, and social intervention programmes as part of efforts to address some of the underlying causes of indiscipline;
- iv. *Further urge* all public office holders, political parties, public institutions, and community leaders to demonstrate exemplary conduct capable of promoting discipline, accountability, integrity, and responsible leadership in the country; and
- v. *Call* on State Governments, Local Government Councils, traditional institutions, religious bodies, educational institutions, and civil society organizations to intensify public enlightenment campaigns on moral values, civic duties, and respect for lawful authority.
