MOTIONS

15. **Need to Accelerate and Strengthen Education and Training Programs for Children and Youth in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) Fields:**
Hon. Canice Moore Chukwugozie Nwachukwu:

The House:

Notes the importance of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) Education in equipping children and youth with the necessary skills, knowledge, and competencies to thrive in the rapidly evolving 21st century global economy;

Aware of the 10th Assembly Legislative Agenda, to drive and support legislation that promotes STEM education at all levels, aligning with national goals for youth development, innovation, competitiveness, and sustainable development;

Concerned about the persistent challenges facing STEM education in Nigeria, including inadequate infrastructure, outdated curricula, and limited access to quality training programs, particularly in under-served communities;

Cognizant of the transformative potential of STEM education in unlocking opportunities for economic growth, job creation, and social advancement by empowering individuals to harness technology, solve complex problems, and propel national development;

Conscious that by strengthening education and training programs for children and youth in STEM fields, Nigeria can unlock the full potential of its human capital through critical and scientific thinking, drive innovation and economic growth, and secure a prosperous future for generations to come;

Resolves to:

- (i) urge the National Agency for Science and Engineering Infrastructure (NASeni) and the Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFUND), to accelerate targeted investments in STEM education infrastructure, including modern laboratories, ICT facilities, and learning resources, to provide students with hands-on experience and exposure to cutting-edge technologies;
- (ii) also urge the Federal Ministries of Education and Innovation, Science and Technology to:
- (iii) prioritize teacher training and professional development in STEM education to ensure educators are equipped with the relevant skills and knowledge to effectively engage students and deliver high-quality instruction;
- (iv) liaise and review the current STEM curricula to align with international standards and evolving technologies to foster critical thinking, creativity, and problem-solving skills among students;
- (v) encourage the government, private individuals, and other stakeholders to invest in the expansion of extra curricula STEM programs, competitions, and initiatives to engage students outside the classroom, inspire interest in STEM fields, and nurture talent and passion for scientific inquiry and innovation; and
- (vi) mandate the Committees on University Education, Federal Polytechnic and Higher Education, Federal Colleges of Education, Basic Education and Services, Science and Technology, TETFUND, Monitoring and Evaluation of Implementation of Legislative Agenda, and Legislative Compliance to ensure compliance and report within four (4) weeks for further legislative action.

16. Need to Provide Palliatives to the Victims of Rainstorm in Warji Local Government Area of Bauchi State:

Hon. Adamu Hashimu Ranga:

The House:

Notes that Warji is a Local Government Area in the Ningi/Warji Federal Constituency, situated in the Central area of Bauchi State;

Also notes that the inhabitants of the constituency are predominantly farmers who farm during dry and rainy seasons, and artisans whose livelihoods depend on daily income;

Aware of the rainstorm which swept through communities across Warji Local Government Area, on 4 June, 2026 internally displacing over four thousand, three hundred and thirty-two (4,332) households across Katanga, Ranga, Tiyin, Gbanga, Haya (Wando), Baima, and Dallaji respectively, causing significant destruction of property and death of a twenty-one year old man;

Also aware that the plight of Warji residents deserves the urgent attention and support of the Federal Government and relevant humanitarian agencies;

Disturbed that the storm destroyed several buildings while others had their roofs blown off, disrupting essential services such as electricity and other basic amenities;

Resolves to:

- (i) urge the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) and North East Development Commission (NEDC) to urgently send relief materials to the affected Communities in Katanga, Ranga, Tiyin, Gbanga, Haya Wando, Baima, and Dallaji and assess the level of damage for further intervention;
- (ii) mandate the Committees on North East Development Commission and Legislative Compliance to ensure compliance with these resolutions; and
- (iii) observe a one-minute silence in honuor of the deceased.
